

Remarks On Board Brig C. H. Adams of

Thursday Feb 18th 1875

Begins with very moderate trades, brig by the wind to the N.E. watch employed making sennet strapping blocks &c. saw one ship steering S. W. (Antone does not seem to get off better) middle & latter parts nearly calm watch employed overhauling foot ropes lifts &c. so ends

Lat 10° 13' S Long 31° 05' W

Friday Feb 19th

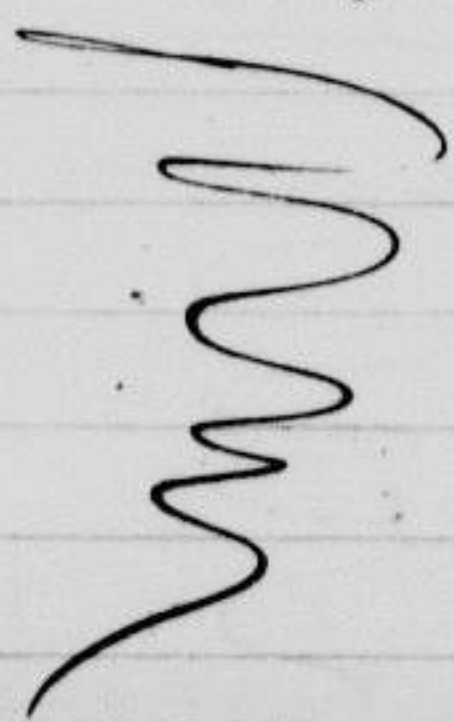
Begins with very light trades & calms brig heading N.W. on these about watch employed fitting foot ropes lifts &c. (saw one sail) middle part calm latter part light airs brig heading from N.E. to N.W. (saw 2 sails) watch employed fitting rigging so ends this day

Lat 9° 38' S Long 31° 15' W

Saturday Feb 20th

Begins with very light baffling winds brig heading N.W. at sight in sight, good large quantities of birds & fish, (Jose Montano sick off duty) middle & latter parts moderate. one sail in sight at 7 Am sent down fore sail for repair. saw large quantities of fish. so ends day (Jose Montano a little better)

Lat 8° 34' S Long 31° 06' W

Sunday Feb 21st

Begins with light trades & fine weather brig heading N.E. by the wind. watch employed repairing fore sail at 4 P.M. finished & bent it. (saw one sail) at 8 P.M. brig heading N.E. by it with all sail set. weather looking some squally, middle & latter part moderate with frequent squalls. at daylight caught a porpoise (saw some blackfish & 3 seals) so ends day

Lat 7° 23' S Long 31° 30' W

Monday Feb 22nd

Begins with moderate trades from E. with frequent rain & wind squalls from N.E. saw a school of blackfish & porpoises (one sail in sight bound to the North. at sundown wind freshening. put a preserver brace on J.D. yard. (Jose Montano on duty again) at 8 P.M. brig heading N.E. under all sail, middle part fine weather steering N.E. latter part squally from E.N.E. steering N & N.W. saw a steamer so ends

Lat 5° 33' S Long 31° 23' W

Tuesday Feb 23rd

Begins with light trades & rain squalls steering N.W. by W. with all drowsing sail set. wind S.E. saw one sail ~~at~~ near fore top gallant Braces at 7 P.M. fine clear weather with a good breeze. middle & latter part fine weather with the exception of once in a while a rain squall. steering N.W. by W. at 12 M. had ought to have seen the Island of Ferdinand & de Norona but I find that my Chron. is out of the way. I think the ship is to the westward of it. But cannot tell for certain so ends

Lat 3° 47' S Long by Chron 32° 30' W

Antone much the same

Repaired fore sail.

At 10:00 AM
Caught a Porpoise
Saw some Blackfish

Jose Montano sick off duty
Jose Montano on duty again
