

Remarks on Board Brig E. Adams of

Wednesday Feb 24th 1875

Begins with light trade from S.E. steering
by N. by Compass looking for S. De Vrona
on the Roccos water employed repairing
main sail overhauling foot ropes &c. at 5:30
P.M. Caught a porpoise at 6 P.M. steered
brig N.E. with all drawing sail set. I have
given up trying to find out about my
China and am going to finish the Beeson
on dead reckoning (Antoni seems to be
about the same) Wind at port moderate
latter part much the same water employed
making new fil foot ropes at 11 A.M. when
weeded to N.E. very light so ends
Lat 2:25 S Long 33:20 W.

Thursday Feb 25th

Begins with fine weather wind light &
baffling from E to N.E. brig by the wind
to the Northward with all sail set water
employed variously Cook employed boiling
porpoise blubber middle part light wind
latter part fine breeze from N.E. brig
heading N.N.W. water employed breaking
out for coal & shifting keg from cask
into barrels so ends
Lat 1:10 S Long 34:25 W.

Friday Feb 26th

Begins with light baffling wind from
N.E. to N.N.E. brig by the wind to N.N.W. with
all sail set water employed, stowing, hold,
at 7 P.M. more wind brig heading N.N.W.
middle part very moderate wind N.N.E.
latter part calm water employed repairing
middle sta. suit so ends
Lat 0:40 S Long 35:25 W.

Rem Bedford Mrs. C. Brownell Master,

Saturday Feb 27th

Begins with fine weather but calm at 6 P.M.
took a light rain from the N.E. Brig heading
N.N.W. under all sail. today times nothing to
be seen hereabouts. except small fish
(Antoni no better) middle & latter part nearly
calm water employed painting main boat
so ends this day
Lat 30 miles S Long 35:55 W.

Sunday Feb 28th

Begins with fine weather but without any
wind at 1 P.M. took a light air from N.E.
brig heading N. at 3 P.M. had a squall from
E. since that had a fine wind - breeze from
E to S. N.E. at 8 P.M. brig heading N by E.
headed so until 12 M. then wind died out
& veered until it was N.E. latter part nearly
calm until 10 A.M. then had a light air
from E. N.E. so ends
Lat 23 N Long 36:40 W.

Monday March 1st 1875

Begins with a light breeze from the eastward
brig heading N by E. at 4 P.M. wind freshened
some at 8 P.M. had a fine breeze with
some passing rain squalls (Antoni better
today) (saw some Grampuses & Porpoises)
middle part squally latter part fine
weather but rougher than employed
painting L Boat so end wind E.N.E.
Lat 1:40 N Long 36:59 W.
