

Remarks On Board Brig E. H. Adams of

Tuesday March 2nd 1875

Begins with strong breeze from E. N. E. by the wind to N. & E. with all sail set same sail steering N. N. W. at 8 P. M. weather squally with a heavy swell from the N. E. middle & latter parts fresh breeze roused & squally at 9 A. M. took in top. Sailed out sail wind E. N. E. so ends

Lat 3° 20' N Long 37° 32' W

Wednesday March 3rd

Begins with fresh breeze from N. E. to E. squally rain & roused at 4 P. M. rose near N. J. Gallant Halyards at 7:30 P. M. had a squall accompanied with thunder lightning & rain took in light sail & middle & part squall with continual rain latter part squally strong breezes but no rain big heading from N. N. E. to N. N. W. so ends

No observations this day

Thursday March 4th

Begins with strong squally trades from E. to N. E. by the wind under jibs top sail staysails & a single reefed main sail. (Antone about the same) middle part strong trades & roused with smoky atmosphere wind N. E. latter part much the same with an occasional rain squall. so ends

Lat 5° 43' N Long 39° 40' W

Friday March 5th 1875

Begins with strong trades & squally. wind N. E. big heading N. N. W. under jib top sail staysails & reefed mainsail at sun down more moderate. set fly jib. hands employed in ships duty. middle & latter part fresh breezes & smoky weather hands employed at ships duty. To day is the 32nd Anniversary of my birth and I am fully aware that I am growing old as I can feel it in my bones & see it on the top of my head.

Lat 6° 51' N Long 40° 35' W

Saturday March 6th

Begins with fine weather with fresh trades at 12:30 shook the reef out of mainsail & set fly jib at 5 P. M. set J. Gallant sail at sun down set gaff top sail. at 7 P. M. got an altitude of the polar star & found our latitude to be 7° 24' N. vessel heading N. by W. under all sail with fine weather middle & latter part fine weather big heading from N. to N. N. W. under all sail so ends

Lat 8° 41' N Long 41° 10' W

Sunday March 7th

Begins with fine weather & smooth sea big heading N. by W. by the wind with all sail set saw Finback Sunfish & Porpoise at 7 P. M. quite moderate, middle part fresh trades from N. E. latter part strong breezes at 8 A. M. took in Gaff top sail & J. Gallant sail saw porpoise, Blackfish so ends

Lat 10° 46' N Long 42° 25' W
