

Remarks On Board Brig C. H. Adams of

Wednesday April 21st 1875

Begins with light N.W. wind and a heavy cross sea running, steering brig E. N.E. employed etc. repairing Stern boat, saw one sail bound to the N.E. at 1 P.M. nearly calm brig labouring heavily, middle part much the same. latter part heavy sea and fine weather otherwise, at 4 P.M. started N. so ends

Lat 28° 18' N Long 55° 50' W.

Thursday April 22nd

Begins with fresh westerly wind steering brig N.W. under short sail. a heavy sea running from N.W. employed repairing stern boat, at sundown luffed to the wind heading N.W. gave the watches in charge of Boatsteers, middle part more moderate at daylight shook reef out of topsail & steered N.E. latter part fresh N.W. & suggested watch employed cleaning windlass gear, etc. & repairing Stern boat. so ends

Lat 29° 40' N Long 55° 34' W.

Friday April 23rd

Begins with fresh N.W. wind & a rough sea steering brig E. (saw some squall) at sundown luffed by the wind & reefed the topsail, brig heading N.W. middle part fresh S.W. wind with occasional rain squall at 12 m hauled up, the foresail latter part strong W. S.W. wind brig by the wind until 8 A.M. then steered E. finished Stern boat turned her over the try works & painted watch employed making Pumpjam so ends

Lat 30° 24' N Long 55° 00' W.

New Bedford Wm. C. Brownell Master,

Saturday April 24th 1875

Begins with fresh wind from N.W. & a rough sea steering brig E. (saw 2 finbacks & one seal weather smoky had seeing at sundown no ship. to N.W. & shortened sail, middle part fresh breeze & frequent rain squalls at daylight had sail & steered E. with cloudy & smoky saw one seal watch employed cleaning Spades &c. so ends

Lat 30° 43' N Long 55° 11' W.

Sunday April 25th

Begins with fresh S.W. wind steering brig E. with all square sails set at sundown shortened sail & luffed by the wind on S. tack, heading S.E. (saw some Grampuses) middle part strong S.W. wind & a rough sea brig by the wind to S.E. at 8 A.M. furled the fore sail saw nothing so ends

Lat 30° 41' N Long 53° 00' W.

Monday April 26th

Begins with strong S.W. wind & a rough sea brig by the wind to S.E. at sundown most moderate with smoky atmosphere, middle part squall wind veered to W. at daylight steered brig E. S.E. at 10 A.M. wind shifted in a squall to N.W. fresh breeze & cloudy weather, (saw some grampuses) at 12 find weather again watch employed variously so ends

Lat 30° 06' N Long 51° 32' W.
