

Remarks On Board Brig E. H. Adams &

Friday May 14th 1875

Begins with light easterly wind steering brig S. N. E. with all sail set. weather fine sea smooth, nothing to be seen. at sundown shortened sail as usual & hauled aback the fore yard, brig heading N. N. E. middle & latter part fine weather at daylight braced forward & made sail by the wind to N. E. by N. one sail in sight. watch employed setting gunnion fishing for Gibbon so ends
Lat 33° 09' N Long 55° 25' W.

Saturday May 15th

Begins with fine weather brig by the wind to S. E. with all sail set. one sail in sight. saw finbacks & some squid & drift wood. at sundown shortened sail as usual. middle & latter part fine weather light easterly wind at daylight made sail & steered N. W. at 11.30 A. M. saw a whaling bark to leeward so ends (saw finbacks)
Lat 35° 40' N Long 55° 38' W.

Sunday May 16th

Begins with light easterly wind steering brig N. by S. a whaling bark in sight. saw finbacks & Grampus at sundown shortened sail as usual. at 8 P. M. luffed by the wind to S. at 3 A. M. was ship to S. E. at daylight brig heading E. by N. made sail & steered N. E. saw some pieces of squid & 2 vessels so ends
Lat 36° 06' N Long 55° 38' W.

(Saw Whaling Bark) (Conning)

New Bedford Mr. C. Brownell Master.

Monday May 17th 1875

Begins with fresh breeze from S. E. partially cloudy weather steered brig N. saw 2 sails bound Eastward (saw a finback) at sundown shortened sail & luffed by the wind heading S. W. (saw a turtle) middle part fresh breeze brig heading S. W. latter part steering S. N. W. saw 3 sails
Lat 36° 17' N Long 56° 20' W.

Tuesday May 18th

Begins with fresh breeze from S. E. steering E. by N. at 5 P. M. 2 P. M. Brig pictorial. 7 days from N. Y. home. few barabados with houses & general concern at sundown shortened sail heading E. by N. middle part moderate latter part strong breeze from S. E. brig under short sail heading E. saw 2 sails & finbacks & 2 turtles & plenty of drift wood so ends
Lat 36° 48' N Long 56° 25' W.

Wednesday May 19th

Begins with fresh breeze from S. E. brig heading E. by N. under short sail. saw 1 turtle finbacks & 3 sails at sundown tacked ship to S. W. by N. & took in 1/2 middle part wind & weather much the same at daylight tacked ship to E. weather fine but fresh breeze saw plenty of drift wood & one live squid & finbacks so ends
Lat 36° 49' N Long 56° 06' W.
