

Remarks On Board Brig E. H. Adams of

Thursday May 20th 1875

Begin with fine weather & a fresh breeze from S. by the wind to Eastward saw lots of drift wood. at sundown tacked ship to N. S. W. & shortened sail. (saw some porpoises) middle part moderate at 12 m wind veered to S. S. W. wore ship to S. E. latter part fine weather vessel under all sail heading E. S. E. at 8:30 A.M. lowered S. B. & caught a turtle saw one seal & ends

Lat 36° 49' N Long 55° 48' W.

Friday May 21st

Begin with fine weather wind S. S. W. by the wind to S. E. saw some porpoises at sundown took in light sail & mainsail brig heading S. E. middle & latter part fine weather wind S. W. saw finbacks lowered and caught a turtle so ends brig heading S. E. with all sail set

Lat 36° 13' N Long 54° 32' W.

Saturday May 22nd

Begin with fine weather wind veering to S. S. W. & freshening at 3 P.M. took in top gallant sail saw large quantities of finbacks & 2 seals at sundown cloudy weather but more moderate. took in light sails & mainsail brig heading S. E. by E. middle part much the same at daylight saw large quantities of finbacks so ends (saw Blackfish)

Lat 35° 20' N Long 51° 47' W.

Sunday May 23rd 1875

Begin with fresh breeze from N. S. W. steering brig E. S. E. with all drawing sail set saw finbacks turtle, spars & one sail. at sundown more moderate took in light sail & reefed the topsail. steering E. S. E. middle & latter parts fresh breeze & smoky weather saw finbacks & killers & some drift wood. 1 seal in sight steering brig E. S. E. with all square sail set & ends

Lat 35° 18' N Long 49° 07' W

Monday May 24th

Begin with fresh breeze from west S. W. cloud & smoky atmosphere. steering brig E. S. E. with all square sail set. saw finbacks porpoises & one sail. at sundown shortened sail & luffed by the wind heading S. W. Mr. Swasey sick & duty threatened with a fever. middle part fresh breeze from S. W. latter part strong wind & rough sea steered brig E. S. E. under all sail reefed topsail & foresail so ends this day

Lat 34° 46' N Long 47° 17' W.

Tuesday May 25th

Begin with a moderate gale from W. at 1 P.M. close reefed top sail furlled fore sail & luffed to heading S. W. at 3 P.M. had some rain wind veered to N. W. & moderated. cloudy smoky atmosphere. at sundown weather better brig heading N. S. W. (saw one seal) (Mr. Swasey better) middle part more moderate latter part fine weather with a heavy swell from N. wind N. W. light at daylight made sail steered E. by S. watch employed at ships duty so ends

(Mr. Swasey better)
