

Remarks On Board Brig E. H. Adams of

Tuesday June 8th 1875-

Begins with fine weather wind E. at 12:10 P.m. tacked ship to N.N.E. water employed heading for sail breaking out for small stores &c. saw Blackfish & porpoises & 2 sticks of timber at sundown shortened sail as usual, middle & latter parts strong breeze from E.S.E. big by the wind to N.E. saw one sail steering to the Westward so ends

Lat 34° 53' N Long 42° 10' W.

Wednesday June 9th

Begins with strong breezes from E.S.E. & a rough sea steering brig N.W. by sundown short sail (saw a ship steering N.W.) at sundown wore ship heading S and furled foresail, weather looking nasty middle and latter parts strong breeze & ragged. at 8 A.m. steered N.W. (saw a whaling ship to leeward lying to so ends)

Lat 34° 33' N Long 43° 16' W.

Thursday June 10th

Begins with strong breeze from E.S.E. steered brig N.W. by N at 2 P.m. luffed by the wind to N.E. at 3:20 more moderate set fore sail. at 5 P.m. spoke Sch Cohampt Capt Fisher 40 days out clean. at sundown took in fore sail brig heading N.E. by E. middle & latter part fresh breeze at daylight wore ship to S. Cohannet in sight off the lee beam saw another sail so ends this day

Lat 34° 45' N Long 43° 10' W.

Friday June 11th 1875

Begins with fresh breezes from E.S.E. big by the wind to S. at 1 P.m. saw the schooner Monmouth kept off & run for her but found that she had not seen any thing. I went on board of her and the mate of her came here did not change boats crews at 6 P.m. came on board at sunset reefed top sail & furled fore sail brig heading N.E. middle part much the same at daylight wore ship to S. & made sail saw 2 vessels bound to the Northward so ends

Lat 34° 26' N Long 43° 00' W.

Saturday June 12th

Begins with fresh breezes from E.S.E. big by the wind to S. 2 vessels in sight to the leeward at 3 P.m. tacked ship to N.E. (saw Porpoises) at sundown shortened sail as usual, middle part much the same at 11 P.m. wore ship to S.E. at daylight wore ship to N.E. & made sail 2 whalers in sight so ends

Lat 34° 01' N Long 42° 48' W.

Sunday June 13th

Begins with fine weather wind E. big by the wind to S.E. one bark in sight at 12:10 P.m. tacked ship to S.E. vessel under all sail at 2 P.m. spoke the Spartan Tripp reports nothing capt. tripp. came on board, at sundown shortened sail as usual. at 8 P.m. Capt Tripp went on board. middle & latter parts much the same at daylight made sail as usual brig heading S by W. Spartan in sight to windward at 8:20 A.m. saw a white water off our lee bow steered for it but saw it no more. saw 2 other sails so ends

Lat 33° 42' N Long 42° 33' W.
