

Remarks On Board Brig E. H. Adams of

Monday June 14th 1875

Begins with fine weather except a smoky atmosphere big by the wind to S by E under cruising sail. (Saw 3 sails 1 Humph. back & some porpoises) at sundown shortened sail as usual. the spar-tan in sight about 10 miles from middle & latter part fine weather at day. Night wore ship to N.E. by N & made sail watch employed painting to B under the ceiling saw Porpoises & Humph. backs so ends
Lat 33° 07' N Long 42° 28' W.

Tuesday June 15th

Begins with fine weather big by the wind to N.E. under all sail saw 2 schools of Blackfish & some porpoises one sail. at sundown took in sail as usual big heading E. N. E. fitted the steering apparatus middle & latter part fine weather big by the wind heading from E by N to N.E. saw a whaling bark to windward. watch employed breaking out to trim ship. saw Grampuses so ends

Lat 34° 05' N Long 41° 40' W

Wednesday June 16th

Begins with fine weather wind light from E. N. E. saw a schooner to windward supposed it to be the Cohannet. at sundown tacked ship heading S by W. & shortened sail as usual. (Saw some porpoises) middle & latter part fine weather big heading from S by W to S by E. saw one sail porpoises Blackfish Grampuses & picked up a case (10 Gall) of Gasoline (Marked B Callao) so ends

Lat 33° 44' N Long 42° W.

New Bedford William E. Brownell Master

Thursday June 17th 1875

Begins with fine weather wind light from S by S. to E. S. E. at 12 N tacked ship to E. vessel under all sail one vessel in sight bound to the North E. at sundown tacked ship to S by W. & took in Gaff top sail wind very light middle & latter part very light air at 12 N tacked ship heading E by N at daylight heading N by E. saw 2 sails watch employed scraping & painting from work around the wheel. so ends
Lat 33° 52' N Long 41° 52' W.

Friday June 18th

Begins with very light air from E. S. E. big by the wind to N with all sail set at sundown shortened sail as usual 2 sails in sight to windward, middle & latter part very light air saw 1 sail picked up a ton barrel & a piece of plank (saw Porpoises) so ends
Lat 34° 18' N Long 42° 10' W.

Saturday June 19th

Begins with very light air from E. S. E. seeing to E. (saw 2 sails grampuses porpoise, some pieces of squid &c.) at sundown tacked ship to S by E. & shortened sail as usual wind very light. middle part much the same. latter part wind freshening some from E. N. E. big by the wind to S. E. with all sail set saw 2 schools porpoises & 1 sail watch employed variously so ends

Lat 33° 50' N Long 41° 47' W.

Painted from work on under head. shed Blackfish &c.

Picked up a ton barrel & piece of plank &c.
