

Remarks On Board Brig E. H. Adams of

Sunday June 20th 1875.

Begins with fine weather wind E.N.E. brig by the wind to S.E. (saw some Codfish & one sail) at sundown more Codfish took in fore top. Gallant sail. brig heading S.E. by S. middle & latter parts fresh breeze brig heading from S.E. to S.S.E. with all sail set except S.E. & G.S. saw nothing so ends

Lat 32° 50' N Long 40° 20' W.

Monday June 21st

Begins with fresh E wind tacked ship to N.N.E. brig heading from N.N.E. to N with S.E. & G.S. fuddled (saw one sail steering S.) (saw some porpoises) middle & latter parts very moderate saw 2 sails & some porpoises ends
Lat 34° 32' N Long 40° 45' W.

Tuesday June 22nd

Begins with very light baffling wind from E to N.E. brig on Northern tack 2 sails in sight. at 3 P.M. tacked ship to S.E. at 4 P.M. called at 4:30. I went on board the Bark Meets Kent Master of Boston, 19 days from New York. Bound to Melbourne with a general cargo & 2 passengers. (compared chronometers & found them to agree within 3 miles. at 8 P.M. parted company with him.) middle & latter parts nearly calm brig heading from E.S.E. to S.S.E. saw 2 sails & a finback (watch employed cleaning & oiling Mincing Machines so ends the long day)

Wednesday June 23rd

Begins with very light baffling airs from N.E. to E. brig by the wind to the eastward with all sail set 2 vessels in sight at sundown more breeze steady from N.E. brig heading S.E. middle part moderate at 1 P.M. tacked ship to N. latter part wind & weather much the same vessel under all sail saw Blackfish & 2 square headed Grampuses so ends

Lat 34° 40' N Long 40° 04' W.

Thursday June 24th

Begins with fine weather wind light from N.E. brig by the wind to N.N.W. saw one sail, at sundown tacked ship to E.S.E. vessel under all sail, middle & latter part moderate brig heading from E by S. to E.N.E. under all sail saw nothing so ends
Lat 35° 09' N Long 39° 50' E.

Friday June 25th

Begins with fine weather wind light from N.N.E. brig by the wind to E & E by N at 5:30 P.M. saw Blackfish. Lowered all 3 boats & made chase the L.B. struck & got one took him alongside at 7 P.M. took in light sailing brig heading N.W. by N. middle & latter parts light airs at daylight tacked ship to E.S.E. saw Humpbacked porpoise Codfish and one sail so ends

Lat 35° 25' N Long 38° 50' W.
