

Remarks On Board of Brig C. H. Adams of

Saturday June 26th 1875

Begins with very light airs from N. N. E. brig by the wind to S. E. 2 sails in sight, at 4:15 P. M. raised a large long sperm whale going to N. N. W. the 2nd rising lowered 2 Harbored boats & made chase the 3rd time down he went to S. W. the 3rd rising he was going S. the 3rd time down he went to N. N. W. the 4th rising the 2nd B struck him he took all the 2nd B line & 1/2 the waist-boat then the Meates line parted, it being dark we had to give it the boats got on board at 9:15 P. M. weather calm & cloudy, middle part calm untill 3 A. M. then a light breeze from N. N. W. brig by the wind to S. W. at 8:30 locked ship to N. weather some squally saw Crampuses so ends (saw 2 Walrus bones)
Lat 35° 25' Long 39° 55' W.

Sunday June 27th

Begins with fine weather steered brig S. E. by S. Spartan & C. M. Morgan in sight, at 4:30 P. M. the Spartan ran down to us, P. went on board & stayed untill 9 P. M. brig by the wind to S. W. at 10 P. M. wore ship to N. middle part calm latter part fine breeze from N. brig heading N. N. W. under all sail the Spartan off our lee beam so ends
Lat 35° 32' N Long 40° 22' W.

Monday June 28th

Begins with a fresh breeze from N. to N. N. W. at 3 P. M. steered N. E. at sun down shortened sail & luffed by the wind to N. by N. middle part strong breeze & angled at day light steered S. E. under reefed, 1st sail & 2nd sails saw 2 sails & some finbacks so ends
Lat 36° 26' N Long 39° 40' W.

New Bedford Wm. C. Brannell Master

Tuesday June 29th 1875

Begins with a strong wind from N. N. W. & cloudy weather with an occasional rain squall, vessel by the wind to S. or thereabouts under short sail saw 2 sails & finbacks at sun down took in & fueld foresail weather looking threatening met Barometer on the stand at 30.22 in middle part moderate with some rain latter part rainy & calm watch employed boiling Blackfish blubber saw a finback & a piece of squid so ends
Lat 35° 18' N Long 38° 46' W.

Wednesday June 30th

Begins with calm weather and light airs from all quarters with a heavy swell from the N. N. W. at 4 P. M. ran along side of a piece of plank & picked it up & caught 3 dolphins the first of the season, at sun down calm, middle part calm untill 2 A. M. then a light air from N. W. brig heading W. S. W. latter part much the same saw Porpoises one sail so ends
Lat 34° 58' N Long 39° 35' W.

Thursday July 1st

Begins with fine weather & a fine breeze from N. N. W. brig heading W. under all sail. 2 sails in sight, saw Porpoises at sun down shortened sail as usual Mr. Sherry sick off duty middle part a light wind with light drizzling rain brig heading N. N. W. latter part fine weather brig heading from N. W. to N. N. W. under all but light sails saw one vessel so ends
Lat 34° 33' N Long 38° 10' W.
