

Remarks On Board Brig E. W. Adams of

Thursday July 8th 1875

Begins with fine weather wind from S.E. by the wind to E with all sail set. saw nothing at 5 P.M. wind veered to S.E. at sundown tacked ship to S.W. by S. & shortened sail, middle part much the same at 1 A.M. went ship to E.S.E. at daylight made sail as usual at 9 A.M. tacked ship to S.W. (saw Porpoises) so ends.

Lat 35° 47' N Long 42° 27' W.

Friday July 9th

Begins with fine weather wind from S.E. to E.S.E. brig on Lanthorn tack saw 6 seals & some porpoises at sundown shortened sail as usual, brig heading S. middle part much the same at daylight went ship to N.N.E. & made sail as usual latter part moderate 2 sails in sight (saw porpoises) watch employed cleaning windlass gear & painting head gear with coal tar. so ends

Lat 35° 31' N Long 42° 34' W.

Saturday July 10th

Begins with very light easterly wind at 12 on tacked ship to S.E. 3 sails in sight watch employed cleaning & coal tarring windlass gear at sundown shortened sail as usual, middle part much the same at daylight went ship to N.E. at 7 A.M. was boarded by a boat from the British Bark Martha Capt. P. H. Richards & months out. short provisions supplied him with Beef & flour molasses &c. latter part nearly calm so ends saw large quantities of porpoises.

Sunday July 11th 1875

Begins with very light air from S.E. to E. Brig heading to N.E. saw porpoises & grampuses and sail in sight at sundown shortened sail as usual, middle & latter part much the same wind light from S.E. brig by the wind to E. saw one seal & some grampuses so ends

Lat 35° 41' N Long 41° 57' W.

Monday July 12th

Begins with very light air from S.E. brig by the wind to E. at 6 P.M. calm clewed up. Tied down all sail, furlled the light sails at 7 P.M. had a light air from S.E. saw some grampuses & some pieces of squid. middle part more breeze wind hauled to S.W. latter part fine breeze brig heading S.E. by 4 watch employed middle stitching flet pit saw grampuses & picked up a lb of Petrolium so ends

Lat 35° 48' N Long 41° 10' W.

Tuesday July 13th

Begins with fine weather & a fine breeze brig heading S.E. by S. with all sail set watch employed middle stitching middle staysail at sundown nearly calm, shortened sail as usual brig heading S.W. middle part much the same at daylight steered E.S.E. with all sail set saw 1 steamer & 2 sailing vessels so ends

Lat 35° 44' N Long 40° 10' W.

Filled 1 lb (Middle stitched the pit & middle staysail) (Picked up a lb of Petrolium)
