

Remarks On Board Brig E.H. Adams of

Wednesday July 14th 1875

Begins with fine weather wind S.W. with a heavy swell running from N.W. steering brig E.H. with all sail set, one whaling bark in sight. Suppose it to be the *Clarice*, passed a schooner's bowsprit with the hull painted green. (saw plenty of porpoises & one turtle) middle & latter parts much the same at daylight made sail as usual brig heading S.E. by S. saw (Grampuses) and 3 whaling barks & one sch at 9 A.M. tacked ship to W. by N. so ends
Lat 35°. 25 N Long 39°. 38 W.

Thursday July 15th

Begins with fine weather wind from S.W. a whole sail breeze brig heading to the N.W. the E.H. Morgan in sight to windward & a rather bark to leeward. (saw Porpoises) caught 2 Allicins the first for the voyage at sundown shortened sail as usual brig heading N.W. by N. middle part much the same at daylight was ship & made sail brig E.H. saw the E.H. Morgan so ends
Lat 35°. 55 N Long 39°. 48 W.

Friday July 16th

Begins with light airs from S. brig by the wind to E.S.E. at 5 P.M. tacked ship to N.W. at 6 P.M. went on board the Morgan & spent the evening middle part brig heading N.W. at daylight tacked to E.S.E. the Morgan in sight saw Porpoises & Grampuses so ends

Lat 35°. 43 N Long 39°. 32 W.

(Saw Barks *Clarice* & E.H. Morgan & Sch Cohasset and an unknown Bark)

Saturday July 17th 1875

Begins with light airs from S. brig by the wind to E.S.E. with all sail set (saw Porpoises & the Bark *Clarice*) at 4 P.M. nearly calm at sundown Calm took in all sail, the *Clarice* about 5 miles from middle & latter parts very light airs from S.E. 5 whalers in sight at 10 A.M. went on board of the Hadley Capt. Clearland 9 months out with 180 lbs. sperm so ends
Lat 35°. 44 N Long 39°. 55 W

Sunday July 18th

Begins with very light airs from S.E. brig by the wind to V. Sailing with Barks Hadley & Spartan at 9 P.M. came on board middle part much the same. latter part more breeze wind S. brig by the wind to E.S.E. 3 whalers in sight & 6 merchant vessels so ends
Lat 35°. 58 N Long 39°. 30 W.

Monday July 19th

Begins with fresh breeze from S. to S.E. W. brig on different tack by the wind with all sail set at 5 P.M. spoke the E.H. Morgan but did not Gam. at sundown shortened sail brig heading S.E. weather looking squally at 8 P.M. raining middle part strong breezes & equally latter part much the same at daylight 3 sails in sight at 9 A.M. began to rain & continued so to the end of this day

Lat by DR 35°. 20 N Long 38°. 10 W.

(Saw Barks Hadley & Spartan)
