

Remarks On Board Brig E. H. Adams of

Tuesday Aug 17th 1875-

Begins with fresh breeze & a rough sea steering brig E. H. under short sail employed putting a fluke chain on the Starboard side of the foremast for a preventer to the rigging at 4:30 P.M. wore ship by the wind to S.W. saw one sail steering E.S.E. also (saw some porpoises) middle part moderate with frequent rain squalls. latter part nearly calm saw Grampuses. saw new wheel rope so ends
Lat 35° 09' N Long 43° 05' W

Wednesday Aug 18th

Begins with light breeze from N.W. brig by the wind to S.W. with all sail set (saw off a new cutting fall) saw Grampuses at sundown took in light sails. middle & latter parts fine weather & a fine breeze from W.N.W. brig by the wind to S.W. so ends
Lat 33° 43' N Long 43° 25' W

Thursday Aug 19th

Begins with fine weather and W.N.W. brig by the wind to S.W. at 6 P.M. wind veered to N.W. at sundown took in light sails & main sail big heading W by N middle & latter parts fine weather at day light steered E.S.E. watch employed breaking beef out of casks & putting it in barrels so ends
Lat 32° 32' N Long 43° 38' W

Friday Aug 20th

Begins with fine weather steering brig E. H. at sundown steered E by N took in light sails wind S.W. (at 7 P.M. rainy) middle part calm latter part strong breeze from E.S.E. & equally brig by the wind to N.E. under short sail saw some Grampuses so ends
Lat 32° 52' N Long 42° 46' W

Saturday Aug 21st 1875-

Begins with strong breeze from E.S.E. brig by the wind to N.E. under short sail (saw Grampuses at sundown reefed the top sail over (Mr. Thomas Sick with a pain in his Breasts) middle & latter part much the same saw one sail & some Grampuses so ends
Lat 33° 47' N Long 43° 24' W

Sunday Aug 22nd

Begins with fresh breeze from E.S.E. brig by the wind to N (saw Grampuses & one sail at sundown more moderate with a heavy swell from the Eastward. (Mr. Thomas Better) middle & latter parts fine weather so ends
Lat 34° 59' N Long 43° 55' W

Monday Aug 23rd

Begins with fine weather brig by the wind to N with all sail set at sundown shortened sail as usual middle part nearly calm at 11 P.M. wore ship to S.E. by S. at 4 A.M. wore ship to E by N latter part fine weather wind E. watch employed making new Main topal rigging one sail in eight seconds
Lat 35° 31' N Long 44° 27' W

Tuesday Aug 24th

Begins with fine weather steering brig N.W. at 4 P.M. luffed by the wind to N.E. saw Grampuses & one sail at sundown tacked ship to S by E. & made all sail. middle & latter parts fine weather brig by the wind to S.E. with all sail set saw nothing so ends

Lat 35° 09' N Long 44° 15' W
