

Remarks On Board Brig E. H. Adams of

(Pare new Reef Tackles)

Wednesday Aug 25th

Begins with fine weather wind E. N. E. by the wind to S. E. with all sail set square large spar watch employed variously, middle & latter parts fine weather by the wind heading from S. E. to E. S. E. with all sail set some grape-pines so ends
Lat 34° 15' N Long 42° 30' W

Thursday Aug 26th

Begins with fine weather & a fine breeze from N. E. by the wind to E. S. E. with all sail set (nothing to be seen at 7° 30 had a rain squall wind altered to E. middle wind very baffling with frequent rain squalls by heading from E to S. E. latter part much the same without any rain wind very light. watch employed making sighting bluffs so ends
Lat 33° 56' N Long 40° 36' W

Friday Aug 27th

Begins with fine weather wind light from E. at 12° 15 tacked ship to N. E. (saw lots of grape-pines) at sun down tacked ship to N. E. by E, middle & latter parts calm so ends

Lat 34° 07' N Long 40° 40' W

Saturday Aug 28th

Begins with fine weather without much wind by heading E. N. E. at 4 P. M. calm clewed up & down all sail set new topsail braces & throat halgards of the old ones. at 7 P. M. still calm, middle part calm until 4 A. M. latter part light breeze from S. E. to S. S. W. at 10 A. M. picked up an Holston so ends

Sunday Aug 29th 1875

Begins with fine weather with a fine breeze from S. E. W. steering brig S. E. by E with all sail set at 2° 30 P. M. took a large hard pine stick of timber alongside hauled it across deck & cut off one piece towed the other alongside & caught about 250 albicore dressed them for salting at 7° 30 P. M. had a light rain squall watch employed cleaning fish heads. middle part fine weather at 12 M. hauled aboard head yards & lay until daylight then stored E. latter part strong breeze & squally watch employed salting fish so ends
Lat 35° 43' N Long 37° 05' W

(Altered)

Monday Aug 30th

Begins with a strong breeze & rough sea steering brig E. N. E. with square sails set at sun down shortened sail & luffed by the wind heading S. E. nothing but small fish to be seen about here, middle & latter parts strong breeze & rugged at 7 A. M. stored brig E. by Sunday shifted topsail & foresail so ends

Lat 36° 14' N Long 37° 20' W

Tuesday Aug 31st

Begins with strong breeze from S. W. & a heavy swell from N. N. W. steering brig E. by S. at 6 P. M. had a heavy squall of rain in foresail & luffed by the wind to S. E. at 7° 30 P. M. quite moderate but a heavy cross sea running. (saw Porpoises) middle & latter part strong breeze & a light stored N. E. at 10 A. M. stored E. N. E. had some rain squalls so ends

Lat 36° 23' N 35° 40' W
