

Remarks On Board Brig E. H. Adams of

Thursday Sept 9th 1875

Begins with fine weather. Calm until
sign down then a little air from E.S.E.
Crig by the wind, to N.E. with all sail
set except Main sail. (Mr Benton sick
with the Colic) middle & latter parts
fine weather, steering brig E. H. C. saw one
whaleman & some grampuses so ends
Lat 37° 10' N Long 36° 00' W

Friday Sept 10th

Begins with fine weather wind from
S.W. steering brig E. saw grampuses
& Blackfish at sundown shortened
sail & luffed by the wind heading S.E.
(Exchanged Spig with the Spanish brig
Ernesamba & found her to be 20 miles
to the westward of mine) middle part
fresh breeze & squally at 12 m. lost ship.
To N.N.W. at daylight went back again to
the southward at 9 Am. steered E.S.E.
one sail in sight so ends
Lat 37° 18' N Long 34° 35' W

Saturday Sept 11th

Begins with fresh breeze from N.W. steering
brig E. by N with all square sails
& staysails set (saw some grampuses
& Puffins) 2 sails in sight at sundown
flushed the fib, middle & latter parts
light wind and a heavy swell at 8:30 Am
saw the hull of a large vessel on fire steered
for her at 11:30. luffed by the wind
to the windward of her. so ends

Lat 38° 25' N Long 32° 25' W.

New Bedford Wm. C. Brownell Master,

Sunday Sept 12th 1875

Begins with a light breeze from N.W. at
12:30 went aboard of the wreck found
her to be the Iron ship Aurora of
with the inside of her all burned out with
the exception of a small portion of her cargo
which was still on fire picked up a few
Iron bolts &c. & returned board at 4:30 Pm
steered brig E. H. C. with square sails set at
7 P.m. very moderate & clear weather but a
heavy swell running from the N.N.W.
middle & latter parts very moderate with
the same old swell, sail in sight so ends
Lat 38° 46' N Long 31° 50' W

Monday Sept 13th

Begins with very light airs from N. steering
brig E. H. C. with square sails set from a
fin back) also saw a whaling bark to the
leeward called her the H. Adley, middle
part calm latter part light airs at 9 Am spoke
the Bark Leine White 56 days out with 1500 lbs
spum, steered N.E. so ends
Lat 39° 00' N Long 31° 31' W

Tuesday Sept 14th

Begins with light breeze from N.W. steering
N.E. at 6 P.m. steered E. by S at 8 P.m.
wind veered to N.N.E. shortened sail brig
heading E. weather squally, middle & latter
parts strong breeze & rough sea at 6:30 Am
saw the Island of Whorle bearing E. by compass
about 25 miles distant, luffed the South
end of the Island, one sail in sight
so ends with Whorle bearing N 10 miles off
P.M.

I find my Chron to be 50 miles to the
eastward of the land
