

Remarks On Board Brig E. K. Adams of

Friday, Oct 22nd

(Saw many porpoises)
(Saw many turtles)
Begins with light air from N.E. & clear weather steering brig S.W. with all drawing sail set. saw many porpoises & turtles. middle & latter parts light trade saw finbacks watch employed breaking out after hold ends
Lat 24° 43' N Long 18° 28' W.

Saturday, Oct 23rd

Begins with fine weather wind N.E. & steering brig S.W. with square sails & staysails & top sail set (saw finbacks & Porpoises) middle part much the except the wind more to eastward. latter part fresh trade from E. all sail. drawing same Porpoises. so ends (in green water)
Lat 22° 53' N Long 19° 20' W.

Sunday Oct 24th

(Saw Blackfish)
Begins with fresh trades from E. steering brig S.W. with all sail set. (at 5 P.M. saw a school of Blackfish) at 7 P.M. wind E.N.E. with smoky atmosphere, middle & latter part much the same so ends
Lat 20° 24' N Long 20° 20' W.

Monday, Oct 25th

(Capt. Crockett's Porpoise)
Begins with fresh trades & smoky atmosphere steering brig S.W. with all drawing sail set at 3 P.M. saw Porpoises & caught one at 7 P.M. wind & weather the same middle & latter parts much the same fresh trades & smoky wind N.E. so ends

Lat 18° 01' N Long 21° 13' W.

Tuesday, Oct 26th 1875

(Saw Brannet)
Begins with fresh trades & smoky atmosphere steering brig S.W. with all drawing sail set at 2 P.M. wind N.E. moderate both in main sail. saw finback & a steamer bound to the Northward, (run new tentines for all the tubs) middle part much the same latter part more wind & rough. at day light steered S.W. by W. at 9 P.M. sighted the Island of Boavista about 20 miles distant. at 10 A.M. steered S.E. so ends
Lat 15° 50' N Long 22° 10' W.

Wednesday Oct 27th

(Saw Blackfish)
Begins with fresh trades & a rough sea steering brig S.E. with all drawing sail set at 3 P.M. saw a school of Blackfish at 7 P.M. wind more moderate from the N.E. & a smoky atmosphere, middle & latter parts moderate watch employed painting tubs & canvas line tubs covers &c. so ends
Lat 14° 07' N Long 21° 15' W.

Thursday Oct 28th

Begins with light trades & smoky atmosphere steering brig S.E. watches employed cleaning middle part moderate at 8 A.M. had a heavy squall of wind & rain from the Eastward the wind moderate at 10 A.M. saw some blackfish. lowered for them the L.B. got fast & the Iron broke off. then the W.B. got fast with 2 Irons and after the fish was dead in attempting to haul the fish up to the boat both Irons came out & then gave it up & came on board so ends

Lat Byd.R. 12° 50' N Long 21° 40' W.
