

Remarks On Board Brig E. H. Adams of

Tuesday, Nov 30th 1875

Began with very light airs from E. N. E. by the wind to N. W. watch employed doing some slight repairs to the mainsail at sundown took in light sails, middle & latter parts much the same saw 2 sails bound. Southward so ends

Lat 17° 19' S Long 36° 58' W

Wednesday Dec 1st

Began with fine weather wind E. N. E. at 12 tacked ship to S. E. at 12° 30' P. M. exchanged longitude with a German steamer his being 34° 41' W. at 5 P. M. saw breeches of four all low ran for it but saw nothing but some porpoises at sundown took in light sails, middle & latter parts fresh trades & fine weather at 7° 30' A. M. tacked ship to N. by W. saw 3 sails so ends

Lat 18° 02' S Long 36° 16' W

Thursday Dec 2nd

Began with fresh trades brig by the wind to N. by W. & N. W. saw one sail & some porpoises. at sundown took in fly, jib, middle & latter parts fresh breeches & rough sea at 11 A. M. tacked ship to E. N. E. saw 2 sails so ends

Lat 17° 33' S Long 36° 22' W

Friday Dec 3rd

Began with fresh breezes brig by the wind to E. N. E. at sundown reefed the top sail & took in mainsail, middle part much the same at 12 noon ship to N. so ends

Lat 17° 35' S Long 36° 10' W

Main: lighter parts (Strong Southern Current) (Steamer)

Saturday Dec 4th 1875

Began with light North easterly wind brig by the wind to N. N. W. & N. W. watch employed splicing foot main snifter (saw some porpoises) at sundown by moderate took in light sails, middle & latter part fresh breeze brig heading from N. W. to N. by W. so ends

Lat 17° 00' S Long 37° 10' W

Sunday Dec 5th

Began with fresh breeze from N. E. brig by the wind to N. N. W. at sundown tacked ship to E. N. E. & took in light sails & mainsail & reefed the top sail saw one sail, middle & latter parts more moderate saw 2 sails & large quantities of fish so ends

Lat 17° 12' S Long 36° 40' W

Monday Dec 6th

Began with light baffling from the N. E. brig by the wind to E. N. E. saw one sail at 5° 30' P. M. wind veered to E. tacked ship to N. N. E. wind very light had a rain squall did not shorten sail, middle & latter part more breeze brig heading from N. N. E. to N. by E. saw porpoises & one sail so ends

Lat 16° 28' S Long 36° 35' W

Tuesday Dec 7th

Began with fresh easterly wind & fine weather brig by the wind to N. E. at sundown wind S. E. shortened sail to a reefed top sail & stay sails, middle part much the same at 11 A. M. rose ship to S. latter part strong breeze squally & ragged (saw porpoises) so ends

Lat 16° 23' S Long 36° 16' W
