

Remarks On Board Brig E. S. Adams of

Tuesday Dec 14<sup>th</sup> 1875

Begins with fine weather wind light from N.E. steering brig S. S. E. saw nothing at sundown luffed by the wind heading E. S. E. middle part much the same latter part steered S. E. saw 2 sails so ends

Lat 22° 45' S Long 37° 00' W.

Wednesday Dec 15<sup>th</sup>

Begins with fine weather steering brig S. S. E. at sundown spoke Bank Hancock Dowden 6 months out with 100 sperm at 10 p.m. parted company with her. middle part much the same brig heading E. S. E. latter part steered S. S. E. saw nothing so ends

Lat 23° 54' S Long 36° 23' W.

Thursday Dec 16<sup>th</sup>

Begins with fine weather Wind NE steering brig S. E. saw Grampuses & a turtle looked for the turtle but did not catch him at sundown luffed by the wind heading E. S. E. middle part much the same latter part fresh breeze from N. E. at 7 A.M. steered S. S. E. saw 2 sails & porpoises & saw pups so ends

Lat 24° 46' S Long 35° 20' W.

Friday Dec 17<sup>th</sup> 1875

Begins with fine weather wind fresh from N. E. steered brig N. by S. under short sail. at sundown luffed by the wind heading N. W. by N. middle part much the same latter part steered N. W. fine weather. saw Grampuses so ends

Lat 25° 07' S Long 36° 25' W.

Saturday Dec 18<sup>th</sup>

Begins with fine moderate weather steering brig N. N. W. saw one sail & some porpoises, at sundown luffed by the wind heading N. by W. middle part much the same at daylight was ship to E. S. E. latter part fresh weather saw nothing so ends

Lat 25° 10' S Long 36° 25' W.

Sunday Dec 19<sup>th</sup>

Begins with fine weather a good swell from N. E. & a heavy swell from S. W. at 12 steered brig S. W. (saw nothing) at sundown luffed by the wind heading N. by W. middle part much the same latter part fine weather at daylight steered S. W. at 5° 20' A.M. raised a brace to the N. W. run for it until 7 but saw nothing more steered S. W. again at 7° 30' raised another to the west S. W. and some spouts run for them layed aback & spin raged one way and the other at 11° 30' had seen nothing steered south so ends

Lat 25° 42' S Long 37° 03' W.
