

Remark, On Board Brig C. C. Adams of

Tuesday Jan 24th Continued 1875
Better part fine weather at 8 Am hooked on
& took in the junk, went to work & cut it
up & put it in casks so ends
Lat 28° 03' S Long 38° 50' W

Wednesday Jan 26th
Began with fine weather wind N.E.
all hands employed on oil at 2 Pm
started the work, & went to bailing
case at 5 Pm finished the case, tried
to boil the junk, but could not get
it up & run the case through the press
at 9 Pm cooled down, middle part
watches minding up the junk & put it in
casks and left the oil run out steady
middle & latter parts fresh breeze & E
suggested at 1 Am went to work running
down oil at 12 Am suggested wind N.E.
strong, got about 30 lbs of oil done so ends

Lat 28° 21' S Long 39° 10' W

Thursday Jan 27th
Began with strong N.E. wind & a
rough sea bringing here to under jib
& reefed main sail employed steering
oil at 6 Pm finished running all but
3 casks, cleaned up deck &c. at 7 Pm
wind moderate, set reefed topsail big
heading N.W. middle part much the
same at daylight went ship to E. at 6
Am wind shifted to S.W. with rain & continued
to rain until 12 with a heavy cross sea.

Friday Jan 28th 1876
Began with light S.W. wind & ran
squarely steering big North topsail & fore sail
set at sun down nearly calm with drizzling
rain, middle part much the same
latter part wind S.E. partially cloudy
weather & heavy swell from S.S.W. steering
big N. Sam Fri back watch employed
coopering & staining Oil, so ends
Lat 27° 20' S Long 39° 30' W

Saturday Jan 29th
Began with fresh S.W. wind & a rough
sea from S.S.W. steering big N under
top sail & fore sail at 1 Pm down
reefed the top sail & luffed by the wind
heading E.N.E. middle & latter parts
moderate with wind from all points &
frequent rain squalls watches employed
sheering out junk & throwing it over
board & big under sail so ends
No Observations to day

Sunday Jan 30th
Began with moderate weather & rain
at 4 Pm held up sailing watch employed
washing ship at 4 Pm took a fresh breeze
from S.E. big heading E.N.E. at 7 Pm
weather looking better wind the same (few
Grampus & large albacore & flying squid)
middle & latter parts moderate with some
rain saw several Head gram-pus (pigeons)
at daylight steered N until 8 Am then S.W.
by W until the end of this day
Lat 25° 29' S Long 39° 20' W
