

Remarks On Board Brig E. H. Adams of

Sunday Feb 6<sup>th</sup> 1876  
Begins with light Northw. wind brig by the wind to N.W. one sail in sight. at sun down nearly calm & heavy swell from N.E. big rolling & tumbling about fearfully. middle & latter part moderate clouds weather saw one sail so ends  
Lat 26° 20' S Long 40° 14' W.

Monday Feb 7<sup>th</sup>  
Begins with moderate weather wind N.W. brig by the wind to W. saw some grampuses at 4 P.M. wind shifted to S.W. where ship to N.W. it then began to rain at 7 P.M. some S.E. big heading S.S.W. still raining & nearly calm. middle part much the same latter part fresh breeze from E. S.E. at daylight steered N.W. at 7 A.M. had a heavy rain squall from the N.W. cleared down to sea until the squall was over & luffed to at 11 A.M. cleared up then steered W. so ends  
Lat 26° 50' S Long 41° 10' W.

Tuesday Tuesday Feb 8<sup>th</sup>  
Begins with fresh breeze from the eastward steered brig N.E. weather thick with frequent rain squalls at sun down luffed by the wind to N.E. at 8 P.M. wind shifted to a squall to N.E. raining middle part squally latter part fine weather fresh breeze from N.E. saw grampuses breeding & saw 2 sails bound to S.W. so ends  
Lat 26° 16' S Long 41° 40' W.

Wednesday Feb 9<sup>th</sup> 1876  
Begins with fresh breeze from N.E. brig by the wind to N.W. with partially cloudy weather & rugged. saw grampuses & one sail watch employed making spunges middle & latter part fresh breeze & long sea saw grampuses brig by the wind to N.W. so ends  
Lat 25° 38' S Long 42° 35' W.

Thursday Feb 10<sup>th</sup>  
Begins with fresh breeze from N.E. steered brig N.W. under short sail. at sun down luffed by the wind to E. S. middle & latter part very strong N.E. wind & a rough sea at daylight steered S. saw grampuses so ends  
Lat 26° 50' S Long 42° 34' W.

Friday Feb 11<sup>th</sup>  
Begins with very strong Northw. wind a rough sea & smoky atmosphere steering brig S. saw one sail at sun down more moderate luffed by the wind heading E. by N. middle & latter part moderate with a heavy sea from N.E. brig by the wind to N.E. by E. saw 6 or 7 fish & one sail so ends

Lat 27° 33' S Long 41° 20' W.
