

Remarks On Board Brig E. "H. Adams" of

New Bedford Wm. C. Brounell Master.

Thursday Feb 24th 1876
Begins with fresh breeze from N.E.
brig by the wind to E & E by N. 3
sailed in sight at sundown most
moderate, middle & latter part fine
weather brig heading from E by N to E by S.
with all sail set. watch employed looking
out saw 3 sails so ends
Lat 23° 13' S Long 28° 17' W.

Friday Feb 25th
Begins with fine weather and a fine
breeze from N.N.E. at 12 m tacked ship
to N.N.W. saw 3 sails at 5° 30 P m
tacked again to E by N. wind very light.
middle & latter part light winds with
occasional rain squalls at 2 m tacked
ship to N.N.W. saw 2 sails so ends
Lat 22° 36' S Long 28° 12' W.

Saturday Feb 26th
Begins with light-buffing wind from
N.E. to N.W. brig by the wind to N.W.
at 7 P m brig heading N wind very
light, middle part some squalls
latter part squalls. buffing wind
brig heading from N.E. & to N.W.
at 10 m saw the island of Trinidad
about 70 miles distant bearing N.E. by
N. saw 3 sails so ends
Lat 21° 21' S Long 29° 45' W.

(Trinidad)

Sunday Feb 27th 1876
Begins with buffing squally light & strong
wind from E.S.E. to N.N.E. the island
of Trinidad in sight 2 sails. at sundown
the island bore E.S.E. distant 50 miles
more or less, brig heading N.E. & 1/2 E.
middle part fresh breeze brig heading
about the same. latter part brig heading
N. saw 2 sails so ends
Lat 19° 14' S Long 30° 18' W.

Monday Feb 28th
Begins with light buffing wind from
E. to N. brig by the wind on I tack 2
sails in sight. at 7 P m fresh breeze brig
heading N.N.E. good hard pull, middle
& latter part wind & weather much the
same saw one sail. so ends
Lat 16° 51' S Long 30° 25' W.

Tuesday Feb 29th
Begins with fresh trades from E by S.
steering brig N.E. by N. with all sail set
3 sails in sight, middle part fine
weather & a fresh breeze untill 4 m
then squalls. latter part had some
heavy squalls of wind & rain from E.N.E.
& air moderate between squalls. saw
one sail so ends
