

Remains On Board Brig E. H. Adams of

(Star Topail)

Tuesday March 9th 1875
Begins with light South. easterly wind
brig heading from N. to N.E. & water
is a little rough & repairing for top sail at
2:30 P.M. finished & bent it - at 7 P.M.
wind freshening some brig heading N.E.
middle & latter part wind & weather
much the same at 9:30 P.M. sent
in fly jib for repairs. so ends

Lat 3° 25' N Long 27° 58' W.

(Fly Jib)

Wednesday March 10th
Begins with light trades. Brig by the
wind heading S.E. watch employed
repairing fly jib at 1:30 P.M. finished
& bent it. I found the fly jib stay
stranded in the hole & fixed it &
while setting it up. parted it again
then applied another piece of rope
to it & set it up at 6 P.M. had a light
rain squall wind light from S.E. & no
sail in sight. middle & latter part
much the same with the exception of occasional
rain squall saw one sail so ends
Lat 1° 33' N Long 27° 57' W.

(Primer)

Thursday March 11th
Begins with very light easterly wind
with frequent rain squalls. Brig by the
wind to N.E. at 6 P.M. spoke the English
bark Primera bound to Valparaiso,
middle & latter part light wind & squally
until 9 P.M. then a fresh breeze from N.E.
saw 3 sail & some gram puse so ends
Lat 0° 19' N Long 27° 56' W.

New Bedford William C. Brown with Master

(Cleaned Windlass)

Friday March 10th 1875
Begins with fine weather & a fresh breeze
from S.E. and a swell from S.W. & starting
brig N.E. with all sail set (saw one sail
& some canvas.) watch employed shifting
fresh water & filling with salt middles
& latter part fine weather moderate & e.
saw 3 ships & e. watch employed
repairing main sail, saw one sail so ends
Lat 1° 19' N Long 27° 25' W.

(Cleaned Windlass)

Saturday March 11th
Begins with very light airs from S.E.
starting brig N.E. watch employed cleaning
windlass & gear. Saw Porpoises & Blackfish
also 2 swordfish. middle part calm
with frequent rain squalls. latter part fine
weather with light airs from N.E. to E.N.E.
brig by the wind (saw Blackfish & 2 sail.)
Lat 2° 16' N Long 27° 50' W.

(Took N.E. Trades)

Sunday March 12th
Begins with partly cloudy weather wind
light & baffling from N.E. to E.N.E.
brig by the wind (saw 3 sail.) at 7 P.M.
shift a fresh breeze from N.E. middle
part moderate with frequent rain squalls.
latter part much the same until then
a fresh breeze from N.E. brig heading
N.W. saw one sail so ends
Lat 3° 34' N Long 28° 52' W.
