

Remarks On Board Brig E. H. Adams of

New Bedford. Cruising On Twelve-Forty Grounds.

Monday April 17th
Begins with moderate trades big by the wind heading from N.E. by E. to N.W. by W. nothing to be seen mid & lat part much the same latter part fine weather saw finbacks & 2 sails. so ends
Lat 13° 00' N Long 42° 18' W

Tuesday April 18th
Begins with fine weather. big by the wind to N.N.E. at 2 P.M. spoke Bank Lancer Dunder 100 mths out with 1000 lbs. sperm at 4 P.M. spoke Bank Janet Cartland 12 months out with 600 lbs. sperm mid & lat part fresh breeze & squally big by the wind to S.E. latter part much the same at 7° 30' tacked ship to N.N.E. saw 2 sails so ends
Lat 12° 44' N Long 42° 20' W

Wednesday April 19th
Begins with fresh trades big by the wind to N.N.E. nothing to be seen. mid & lat part fresh trades at 3 A.M. wore ship to S.E. at 9° 30' A.M. tacked again to N.N.E. saw one sail and finback & some grampus watch employed to work on the grampus so ends this unprofitable day
Lat 13° 23' N Long 42° 25' W

Thursday April 20th
Begins with fresh trades big by the wind to N.N.E. under short spill saw the Lancer to windward at sundown tacked ship to S.E. mid & lat part wind & weather saw the Lancer & Sch. Louisa & so ends
Lat 13° 00' N Long 42° 05' W

Friday April 21st
Begins with strong trades & a rough sea tacked ship to N.N.E. saw the Janet. Lancer & Louisa & 2 merchant ships mid & lat part much the same at 72 m tacked ship to S.E. at 10° 30' A.M. saw 2 large schools of blackfish so ends
Lat 13° 05' N Long 42° 08' W

Saturday April 22nd
Begins with fresh trades at 1 P.M. tacked ship to N.N.E. the Janet & Lancer in sight. at 3 P.M. Capt. Cartland came on board & staid until sundown mid & lat part squally. big by the wind to N.N.E. latter part strong trades & ragged saw the Janet Lancer & Louisa at daylight tacked ship to S.E. by S. saw one merchant ship. watch employed shifting fresh water & filling up with salt so ends
Lat 13° 28' N Long 42° 05' W
