

Remarks On Board Brig E. H. Adams of

Sunday June 25th 1876

Begins with light air from S.W. steering brig N.W. with all sail set. at 7 P.M. wind very light from S. (saw one sail) middle & latter part light air & calm so ends
Lat 27° 29' N Long 69° 33' W

Monday June 26th

Begins with light air from S.W. steering brig N.W. with all sail set (one sail in sight steering the same, middle & latter part much the same saw one sail bound Southward so ends
Lat 28° 23' N Long 70° 36' W

Tuesday June 27th

Begins with fine weather wind S.W. light steering brig N.W. by N.W. at 5 P.M. had a heavy rain squall after which fine weather again with a 4 knot breeze, middle & latter part fine breeze at 8 A.M. started N.W. (but for topmast stay sail) (saw a grampus) so ends this day
Lat 29° 55' N Long 71° 36' W

Wednesday June 28th

Begins with fresh breeze from S.W. steered brig N.W. with all sail set, at sundown took in light sails & luffed by the wind heading N.W. by N. middle part much the same at 10 P.M. wind veered to W. latter part more moderate brig heading N.W. with all sail set so ends
Lat 31° 28' N Long 72° 08' W

Via Bedford Bound to Charleston Ground

Thursday June 29th

Begins with smoky atmosphere a fine breeze from W. & smooth sea brig by the wind to N.W. under all sail. (saw a steamer bound to the N.E.) at sundown shortened sail as usual on evening ground, middle & latter part fine weather at 1 P.M. tacked ship to S.W. saw nothing so ends
Lat 31° 47' N Long 72° 20' W

Friday June 30th

Begins with fine weather & a light air from W. S.W. at 6 P.M. wind veered to S.W. at sundown tacked ship to N.W. (did not shorten sail) middle & latter part fine clear weather (saw 2 sail so ends)
Lat 31° 48' N Long 72° 58' W

Saturday July 1st

Begins with fine clear weather brig by the wind to W. by N. with all sail set (saw one sail bound to N.E.) at sundown took in light sails, middle & latter part fine weather brig heading from N.W. by N. to W. by N. saw 2 sail so ends
Lat 32° 06' N Long 74° 05' W

Sunday July 2nd

Begins with fine weather brig heading W. at 1 P.M. raised a school of small whales 1 point off weather line appeared to be galloped supposed a merchant ship ran over them at 2 P.M. lowered 2 boats & made chase but without success whales going off quick to windward at 3 P.M. boat came on board brig by the wind to N.W. S. under all sail, middle & latter part at 4 A.M. tacked ship to S. at 5 A.M. tacked to N. at 11 A.M. was spoken by Brig Cini of Bermuda for the port
Lat 32° 03' N Long 74° 40' W
