

Remarks On Board Brig E. H. Adams of N.B.

Sunday July 9th

Begins with fine weather with a light air from N.E. brigs on northern tack the cotton net in sight at 5:30 P.m. saw a hard fine spar took it along side & caught some fish & let it go again. at 10 P.m. wind light brig heading N.N.W. with all sail set, middle part brig heading N.N.W. at daylight steered W (saw one seal) bound to the southward so ends

Lat 31° 53' N Long 74° 10' W.

Monday July 10th

Begins with very light air steering brig N.W. at 4 P.m. steered N at 5 P.m. calm at sundown took in all sail, except star sail & reefed topsail clewed down (one sail in sight) middle & latter light air & calms saw 2 sails & some grass-pusses so ends

Lat 31° 52' N Long 74° 36' W.

Tuesday July 11th

Begins with a calm at 10 P.m. had a light air from N.W. steered brig E.N.E. at 7 P.m. very light air & smooth sea took in all but topsail, middle & latter part very moderate at 12 m. luffed by the wind to W. at 11:30 A.m. was spoken by the sch. Enrica P. Newcomb 9 days from Jamaica with fruit for New York, at 1 P.m. I went on board Washington Ocean Pearl & Genly & Potton of 19 days from Bath bound to Charleston S.C. with Deer at 12 came on board so ends

Lat 32° 08' N Long 74° 24' W.

Wednesday July 12th

Begins with very fine weather high the wind heading from N.W. to N.N.W. with all sail set (saw 2 sails & some grass-pusses) at sundown took in light sails brig heading N.N.W. at 11:30 wind ceased to E. we went ship to S.E. & latter part fine weather wind light & baffling from S.W. to E. sails in sight (saw grass-pusses so ends this day)

Lat 31° 58' N Long 74° 48' W.

Thursday July 13th

Begins with fine weather wind light from S.W. by the wind to E.S.E. 2 seals in sight (caught 2 dolphins) at sundown shortened sail, middle & latter parts fine at 12 m. we ship to N.W. at daylight steered E.N.E. saw some grass-pusses at 7:30 steered N.E. so ends

Lat 32° 01' N Long 74° 33' W.

Friday July 14th

Begins with fine weather at 12:30 raised a beach about 15 miles off bearing N.E. run for it at 2 P.m. made out sperm whales coming quick to windward at 4 P.m. lowered for them they immediately turned & went S.W. the wind very quick chased them until 6 P.m. came on board, at sundown they were about 1 point off the bow brig heading S.W. took in light sails, affine 4 N. at 11 P.m. whales going about S.E. middle part much the same at 2 m. took ship to N.W. latter part fine weather a fine breeze at 7 A.m. tacked to the S.E. (saw some porpoise so ends)

Lat 31° 33' N Long 74° 13' W.
