Saturday Aug 5th

Begins with light northerly wind steering brig S.W. at 2 P.M. until noon vessel secured to N.E. watch employed making fore top mast staysail, the Louisa A in sight, middle & latter parts were light air from E. S. E. started S.W. until then S.W. N. saw one sail, watch employed painting Dr. S. boats & coal tarring iron work. so ends

Lat 33° 12' N Long 74° 18' W.

Sunday Aug 6th

Begins with very light air from the eastern board, steering brig S.W. N. with all sail set. at 6 P.M. finished & bent new fore top mast staysail, middle & latter parts very light air & calms steering brig S.W. N. so ends

Lat 34° 04' N Long 74° 24' W.

Monday Aug 7th

Begins with very light air & calms steering brig S.W. N. at one sail in sight saw sand granules, middle & latter parts light baffling wind at 7:30 A.M. crossed the northern edge of the gulf stream at 11:50 A.M. spoke Sch. Jessie Hart & found his longitude to be 1 degree to the westward of ours steered N. E. so ends

New Bedford Cruising On Charleston Ground

Tuesday Aug 8th 1876

Begins with light airs from S. S. W. steering brig N. N. E. wind freshening at 7 P.M. at a short breeze saw a steamer bound Southward. (struck a porpoise parted hind) & he went away with the (iron) middles & latter parts a fine breeze from S. S. W. to W. S. W. steering brig N. N. E. saw several sail, so ends
Lat 37° 10' N Long 74° 30' W.

Wednesday Aug 9th

Begins with fine weather light breeze from W. at 4 P.M. calm at 6 P.M. a light air from S. S. W. steering brig N. E. by N. & N. (saw a swordfish) watch employed variously, middle & latter part very light baffling from S. E. around Northward to S. E. again at 8 A.M. bent gaff top sail, watches employed variously so ends

Lat 37° 53' N Long 73° 55' W.

Thursday Aug 10th

Begins with fine weather wind light & baffling from N. E. to S. E. brig by the wind to northward with all sail set at 3:15 P.M. spoke 3 mast Sch. Carrie J. Hart. Davis from Providence for Georgetown. went on board & got some late papers took in cutting steeple at 7 P.M. a fine breeze wind E. middle & latter parts wind & weather much the same plenty of vessels in sight, bound to Southward caught a porpoise so ends
