

Remarks on board of Brig

Tuesday Oct 13th

This twenty four hours commence with light southerly wind and good weather headed S E by E hands employed in ship duty Middle part headed S by E latter part headed E by S saw a sail bound to the southward so ends.

Lat 34° 11' Long 50° 32'

Wednesday Oct 14th

First and Middle part this twenty four hours light breeze from S E and good weather headed E S by E latter part fine breeze hands employed in ship duty saw two sails so ends.

Lat 35° 10' Long 49° 28'

Thursday Oct 15th

This twenty four hours commence with fine breeze from Southward and good weather headed E by S Middle part the same latter part fresh breeze headed S E hands employed in ship duty so ends.

Lat 34° 55' Long 46° 50'

Friday Oct 16th

First part this twenty four hours fresh breeze from S S W and dark complexion weather headed S E by S at 7 p m furled the main sail and set the top sail Through the night strong breeze and cloudy shifted S S E latter part the same hands employed in ship duty saw a sail steering S S E so ends.

Lat 33° 54' Long 45° 18'

Saturday Oct 17th

First part this twenty four hours fine breeze and good weather steered S E by S at 9 p m hauled down the top sail and set the main sail Through the night light breeze under all sails latter part the same hands employed in ship duty so ends.

Lat 33° 02' Long 43° 32'

Sunday Oct 18th

First part this twenty four hours calm weather and heavy sea from N W headed S E employed in setting up the head stays and furling out the fore top Through the night took in all the sails at 8 a m had breeze from S E set all the sails headed S S W at 11 wind hauled to the Southward tack ship headed E S E two sails in sight so ends.
