Sunday Oct 25th

This twenty four hours commence with fine breeze from eastward and fair weather headed S by E & at 4 p m tack ship headed N E At 9 tack ship headed S by E & Midnight squally At 1 a m tack ship headed N E by E At 5 a m tack ship headed S E & so ends

Lat 24°44' Long 40°35'

Monday Oct 26th

This day commence with fine breeze from eastward and cloudy weather headed S by E At 2 p m tack ship headed E N E at 8 p m wind head her off tack ship headed S by E At 10 tacked ship headed E N E Latter part fine breeze and good weather hands employed in ship duty saw a sail steering N W so ends

Lat 25°29' Long 39°58'

Tuesday Oct 27th

This day commence with fine breeze from Southeast and good weather headed S E & employed in making cutting stage saw a steamer and a sailing vessel through the night weather the same At 4 a m wind hauled to the eastward tack ship headed S E by E Latter part finish the cutting stage so ends

Wednesday Oct 28th

First part this twenty four hours fine breeze from eastward and fair weather headed S E by E rig the cutting stage and put it out in its place Middle and Latter part fine weather headed S E hands employed in ship duty so ends

Thursday Oct 29th

First part this twenty four hours fine breeze from eastward and good weather headed S E & Through the night fine breeze headed S E & 3/4 S saw a sail steering N W Latter part the same hands employed in ship duty so ends

Lat 23°03' Long 37°15'

Friday Oct 30th

This twenty four hours commence with light easterly wind and good weather headed S E & Middle and Latter part headed S E by E spoke an english Bark from Africa bound to Swansea her long was 36°50 hands employed in ship duty so ends
