

Remarks on Board of Brig

Saturday Oct 31st

This twenty four hours commence with fine breeze from eastward and good weather headed S E by S Through the night the same At 4 a m. pass by a rake Latter part moderate wind hands employed in ship duty so ends

Lat 20° 37' N Long 35° 40'

Sunday November 1st

First part this twenty four hours light easterly wind and fine weather headed S E by S Through the night weather the same light wind from E S E Latter part had rain squalls from N E steered S E saw two sails so end

Lat 12° 58' Long 33° 01'

Monday Nov 2nd

This twenty four hours commence with light breeze from N E and rain squalls steered S E Middle and Latter part moderate weather and rain squalls so ends

Lat 12° 16' Long 34° 17'

Tuesday Nov 3rd

This twenty four hours commence with calm weather At 2 p m saw Blackfish lowered the boats but did not get any At 3 boats returned had light breeze from N E steered S E by S Middle and Latter part the same employed in ship duty so ends

Lat 18° 32' Long 33° 28'

Wednesday Nov 4th

First part this twenty four hours fine breeze from N E and good weather steered S E Middle and Latter part light breeze saw two sails hands employed in ship duty so ends

Lat 17° 41' N Long 32° 10' W

Thursday Nov 5th

This twenty four hours commence with light breeze from N E and good weather steered S E Through the night light air and calm lowered the main sail down and furled set the try sail Latter part the same hands employed in ship duty so ends

Lat 17° 09' N Long 31° 05' W
