Friday Nov 5th

First part this twenty four hours light
air from N.W. and fine weather Steered
S.E. by S. Middle part the same Latter
part calm hands employed in ship duty
so ends

Lat 16° 48' Long 30° 22'

Saturday Nov 7th

First part this twenty four hours calm
headed to the Southward employed in
beaching out & rose new main peak
halhard At 7 p.m. had light breeze
from Eastward headed S by E Through the
night the same Latter part fine breeze
saw several sails bound to the north
ward repaired the old try sail so ends

Lat 15° 44' Long 30° 32'

Sunday Nov 8th

First part this twenty four hours
fine breeze from eastward and passing
clouds headed S by E Through the night
squally Latter part fresh breeze headed
S.E. by S saw one sail steering S by E
so ends

Lat 14° 12' N. Long 29° 22' W.

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Sunday Nov 9th

First part this twenty four hours fresh
breeze from E.N.E. and cloudy weather
headed S.E. by S Middle and Latter part
the same saw two sails so ends

Lat 12° 23' Long 27° 30'

Tuesday Nov 10th

This twenty four hours commence with
strong breeze from E.N.E. and cloudy wea-
ther Steered by the wind headed S.E. by S
Through the night steered S.E. Latter part
the same so ends

Lat 10° 50' Long 25° 04'

Wednesday Nov 11th

This twenty four hours commence with
fine breeze from N.E. and good weather
steered S.E. by S saw a sail steering S by E
Middle and Latter part the same saw a
sail to the eastward made new covers for
line tubs so ends

Lat 9° 15' N Long 24° 19' W.
