

Remarks on board of Brig

Thursday Dec 10th

First part this twenty four hours commences with fresh breeze from Southward and heavy sea headed to the eastward under of short sails employed in getting & finish cutting the whales head through the night halts at work Latter part moderate breeze and good weather At 8 a m took ship headed to the Southward so ends boiling.

Lat 15° 57' S Long 37° 40'

Friday Dec 11th

This day commences with fine breeze from S E and good weather headed to the Southward employed in boiling & heading out for provision Through the night fresh breeze and squally weather Latter part the same saw two sails so ends boiling no obs.

Saturday Dec 12th

This day commence with fresh breeze and squally weather headed to the Southward employed in boiling at 2 p m finish boiling & wash the deck Through the night fresh gale from S E Latter part gale in crease wind hauled at and squally employed in pumping the water out of ground tier stowed the oil below so ends with squally weather and heavy sea no obs.

Sunday Dec 13th

This twenty four hours commences with fresh gale from N N E headed to the eastward employed in stowing the oil & at 4 p m finish stowing the body & 5 b's at 6 p m furled the fore sail Middle and Latter part the same saw 3 sails so ends sun obscured

Monday Dec 14th

This twenty four hours commence with fresh gale from Northward and squally weather headed to the Eastward under of short sails Through the night the same Latter part strong breeze and rainy employed in stowing the head oil below 20 b's and stowed the oil casks so ends no obs

Tuesday Dec 15th

First part this twenty four hours commences with strong breeze from Northward and rainy weather headed to the eastward finish stow the hole at 6 p m wind more moderate wore ship and headed to the Westward set the fore sail and main stay sail Middle and Latter part the same employed in washing the vessel so ends raining.
