

Remarks on board of Brig

Friday Feb 19th

This twenty four hours commences with light breeze from Eastward, and good weather headed N E by N. Middle and Latter part calm and light air headed N N E hands employed in ship duty saw two sails Antone sick so ends.

Lat 9° 38' Long 31° 15'

Saturday Feb 20th

This twenty four hours commences with light air from Eastward and fine weather headed N N E. Through the night and Latter part light breeze At 8 a m under the fore sail hands employed in repairing it Antone sick so ends.

Lat 8° 34' Long 31° 05'

Sunday Feb 21st

This twenty four hours commences with light breeze from East and fine weather headed N N E hands employed in repairing the fore sail at 4 1/2 p m finish it and sent it on Middle and Latter part headed to the Northward had several squalls saw 4 sails Antone sick so ends. saw some black fish.

Lat 7° 23' Long 31° 30'

Sunday Feb 22nd

First part this twenty four hours commences with fine breeze from N E and good weather headed N N W at 3 p m wind hauled to the Eastward headed N N E. Middle part the same Latter part wind hauled S E and squally steered N N E. had some rain so ends. Antone sick

Lat 5° 33' S Long 31° 28'

Monday Feb 23rd

This twenty four hours commences with fine breeze from S E and good weather steered N N W. Through the night and Latter part the same caught a porpoise hands employed in ship duty and Antone sick so ends.

Lat 3° 47' S Long 32° 30'

Tuesday Feb 24th

This twenty four hours commences with fine breeze from S E and passing clouds wore ship and steered N N W looking for Boocas, our Chronometer is out of away at sun down see nothing wore ship steered N N E Middle and Latter part light winds steered the same hands employed in ship duty Antone sick so ends.

Lat 2° 25' S Long 33° 20'

Bowditch to the Northward
