

Remarks on board of Brig

Monday April 5th

This day commences with light trades and fine weather at 1st m. we have to off Dominica North point at day light keep her off steered for the harbour at 1st p. m. came to anchor in 12 fathoms at 3 p. m. sent a raft ashore after water at 5th boat returned so ends.

Tuesday April 6th

A No light trades and good weather At day light sent the boats ashore after water through the day got 130 bbls on board at 4 p. m. sent the boat on shore with the raft at 6 boat returned so ends.

Wednesday April 7th

A No calm and good weather at day light sent after raft of water through the day employed in getting wood at 4 p. m. took 5 casks on shore and fill them full of water at 5th boat returned so ends. and a shore one cask of Blackish oil and 10 gallons more.

Thursday April 8th

A No fresh breeze and fair weather at 5th a m. went shore after water at 6th boat returned with the raft in fore noon employed in getting wood at noon finish wooding and water at 8 p. m. got the recruits At 6 p. m. got under way and steered N W 1/2 N so ends.

Friday April 9th

A No light breeze and fair weather steered N W 1/2 N At 7 A M steered N W by N strong breeze from E N E so ends this day with 12 hours to begin a log.

Saturday April 10th

This twenty four hours commences with strong breeze from E N E and fair weather steered N W by N 1/2 N Through the night the same At 8 a m. keep her off for Moore passage steered W by N 1/2 N saw 3 sails so ends

Sunday April 11th

This day commences with strong breeze from E N E and passing squalls steered W by N at 4 p. m. keep her off W through the night the same Later part steered W N W saw Island of Puerto Rico and saw brig The Baker of Boston so ends.
