Sunday April 18th

This twenty four hours commences with light breeze from S W and fair weather steered N E by N at 5 p m had squall from Westward Through the night light wind from Northward Latter part light air and calm so ends

Monday April 19th

This twenty four hours commences with calm and light air from S W and good weather steered N E Middle and Latter part fine breeze At 7 A m took the stern boat in employed in repairing her at 11 1/2 A m saw Blackfish followed the L Boat at noon boat returned got none so ends

Lat 26.36 Long 58.50

Tuesday April 20th

This twenty four hours commences with strong breeze from N W and cloudy weather Steered E N E Middle and Latter part the same employed in repairing the stern boat saw two sails so ends

Lat 27.37 Long 56.20

Wednesday April 21st

First part this twenty four hours commences with fresh breeze from N N W and heavy sea steered E N E Middle part the same Latter part wind West At 7 A m lay to headed to the northward Employed in repairing the stern boat so ends

Thursday April 22nd

This twenty four hours commences with fine breeze from Westward and fair weather headed N N W At sun down short in sails Through the night the same Latter part fresh breeze from W set the top sail and steered N E employed in repairing the stern boat and cleaning the windlers so ends

Lat 29.40 Long 55.34

Friday April 23rd

This day commences with fresh breeze from westward and passing clouds Steered N E at sun down short in sails Through the night the same At 7.6 m steered E took reef out of the top-sail and finish the stern boat and paint her hands employed in ship duty so ends
