Saturday April 24th

This twenty four hours commences with
fine breeze from Westward and passing
clouds Steered E At sun down short
in sails and lay her to by the wind
headed N W Through the night the same
Latter part set the sails and steered E
hands employed in ship duty so ends

Lat 30° 43' no Long.

Sunday April 25th

This twenty four hours commences with
fine breeze from S W and fair weather
steered E At sun down short in sails
and lay to headed S by E Through the night
the same Latter part fresh gale and clear
weather so ends

Lat 30° 41' Long 52° 00'

Monday April 26th

This twenty four hours commences with
fresh gale from S W and passing clouds
headed S by E under of short sails
Through the night more moderate Latter
part wind hauled to Westward strong
breeze and rainy steered E S E employed
in ship duty so ends

Lat 31° 06' Long 51° 32'

Tuesday April 27th

This twenty four hours commences with
fresh breeze from Westward and passing
clouds steered E S E At 4 p m lay her to
headed W S W put the stern boat over
the stern Through the night the same Latter
part calm and light breeze headed W by S
hands employed in ship duty so ends

Lat 29° 32' Long 51° 57'

Wednesday April 28th

This twenty four hours commences with
calm weather headed W S W sun down
short in sails Through the night the same
Latter part still calm Employed in stowing
up fore rigging so ends

Lat 29° 26' Long 51° 40'

Thursday April 29th

This twenty four hours commences with
calm weather Employed in stowing up main
rigging At 5 p m had breeze from S W
steered N E W Through the night the
same Latter part fine breeze steered the
same hands employed in ship duty so
ends

Lat 30° 26' Long 52° 00'
