

Remarks on board of Brig

E W Adams Capt Perouet 1875.

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Thursday May 6th

This twenty four hours commences with strong breeze from S W and cloudy weather headed W S W At 2 p m wind increase furlled the light sails and reefed the top sail Through the night the same At 4 p m wind hauled to the northward head ber of N E by E At day light tack ship headed W Latter part light breeze fine rain and fog so ends no obs

Friday May 7th

This twenty four hours commences with light breeze from Northward and fine rain headed N W Through the night the same Latter part wind hauled to the S E headed E by N wore ship and steered W N W strong breeze and fine rain At 10 A m wind S W so ends

Lat D R 34° 55 Long 53° 39

Saturday May 8th

This twenty four hours commences with strong breeze from S W and cloudy weather under of short sails headed S W by W Two of the crew got fighting foreward Capt told the mate to hang them up on rigging mate took some spun yarn and make them fast on rigging they was there one hour and twenty five minutes the name of the men Antoine Peter and P V Decker Through the night wind increase At midnight double reefed the fore top sail and reefed the main stay sail Latter part strong gale headed S so ends

Sunday May 9th

This twenty four hours commences with strong gale from Westward and heavy sea headed S S W At 1 p m furlled the weather clew of fore top sail pumps carefully attended At midnight commence to moderate At 5 a m hauled the weather clew of fore top sail and set it Latter part headed W At 9 a m take one reef out of top sail and reef out main stay sail so ends with strong breeze

Lat 32° 13 Long 53° 07 Barometer 29.8 tenths

Monday May 10th

This twenty four hours commences with fresh breeze from N W and heavy sea headed W At 1 p m lose the fore sail and set it Through the night the same and hauled to the northward headed N W Latter part more moderate At day light set the sails so ends under of all sails

Lat 32° 35 Long 54° 03

Tuesday May 11th

This day commences with light winds from Northward and good weather headed N W At sun down short in sails Through the night headed North wind E N E At day light set the sails and steered N N W Employed in repairing the fore gallant sail so ends
