Wednesday May 12th

This twenty four hours commences with light breeze from Eastward and good weather steered N N W Employed in repairing the gallant sail At 4 p m finish it and bent it on sun down short in sails Through the night the same At day light set the sails and headed North with light breeze Employed in setting up the fore and aft stags so ends

Lat 33°15 Long 55°18

Thursday May 13th

This twenty four hours commences with light winds from N E headed to the Northward Employed in ship duty At sun down short in sails Through the night the same Latter part set the sails headed N N E under of all sails so ends

Lat 34°18 Long 55°34

Friday May 14th

This twenty four hours commences with fine breeze from Eastward and fine weather headed N N E At sun down short in sails and hauled the head yard back Through the night the same At day light set the sails so ends with light breeze saw one sail to the Eastward

Lat 35°09 Long 55°25

Saturday May 15th

First part this twenty four hours commences with light breeze from Eastward and fine weather headed N N E At sun down short in sails headed to the Eastward Through the night the same At day light set the sails and steered N W so ends

Lat 35°40 Long 55°38

Sunday May 16th

First part this twenty four hours commences with light breeze from S E and good weather Steered W N W saw a whaler to the Northward At sun down short in sails headed South Through the night the same At 3 p m wore ship headed to the Eastward Latter part set the sails and steered N N E so ends

Lat 36°06 Long 55°40

Monday May 17th

This twenty four hours commences with fine breeze from Southward and fair weather steered W At sun down short in sails headed S W by W Through the night the same At day light set the sails and steered N N W employed in breaking out for provision and water so ends
