

Remarks on board of Brig

Tuesday May 18th

This twenty four hours commences with fresh breeze from Southward and fair weather. The ship steered E by N spoke Brig Victoria of New York 7 days from home. At sun down short in sails headed to the Eastward. Through the night moderate. Latter part strong breeze so ends.

Lat 36° 48 Long 56° 25

Wednesday May 19th

This twenty four hours commences with fresh breeze from Southward and passing clouds headed E by S. At sun down short in sails tack ship headed S W by W. Through the night the same. At day light wore ship and set the jib and middle stay sail so ends.

Lat 36° 49 Long 56° 06

Thursday May 20th

This twenty four hours commences with fresh breeze from S headed E S E. At sun down wore ship headed W S W furled the jib and middle stay sail. Through the night the same. Latter part set all the sail tack ship headed E S E so ends.

Lat 36° 50 Long

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Friday May 21st

This twenty four hours commences with fine breeze from S W headed S E. At sun down furled the light sails. Through the night the same. Latter part set the light sails and stored S E by E so ends.

Lat 36° 13 Long 54° 32

Saturday May 22nd

First part this twenty four hours commences with fresh breeze from S W and passing clouds steered S E by E. Through the night the light sails. Latter part set sails had fine breeze and fair weather. Employed in ship duty saw blackfish so ends.

Lat D B 35° 20 Long 51° 47

Sunday May 23rd

This twenty four hours commences with fine breeze from S W and cloudy weather. Steered E S E. At sun down short in sails. Through the night the same. At day light set the sails so ends.
