

Remarks on board of Brig

Monday May 24th

This twenty four hours commences with fresh breeze from SW and passing clouds steered SE At sun down short in sails and huf to headed S 1/2 E Through the night the same Latter part fresh gale from Westward steered SE by E At 9 a m steered SE & so ends wind increasing.

Lat 34° 40' Long 47° 17' Bar 29.8

Tuesday May 25th

This twenty four hours commences with fresh gale from WNW and squally weather furled the fore sail and double reef fore top sail huf to headed WSW Through the night the same Latter part steered E 1/2 S set fore sail fore top sail and gallant sail so ends wind moderating

Lat 34° 20' Long 46° 22'

Wednesday May 26th

This twenty four hours commences with fine breeze from NW and passing clouds steered E At sun down short in sails huf to headed NNE Through the night the same Latter part set the sails and steered NE so ends

Lat 35° 06' Long 44° 54'

Thursday May 27th

This twenty four hours commences with strong breeze from WNW and cloudy weather steered SE At sun down short in sails huf to headed North Through the night the same Latter part set the fore sail and steered SE & so ends

Lat 35° 21' Long 43° 25'

Friday May 28th

This twenty four hours commences with strong breeze from Westward and passing clouds steered SE by S At sun down hauled the fore sail up huf to headed SW 1/2 S Through the night the same At day light were ship headed to the Northward so ends with strong breeze

Lat 34° 38' Long 42° 38'

Saturday May 29th

This twenty four hours commences with strong breeze from W by S and cloudy weather headed to NW At sun down hauled the fore sail up Through the night the same Latter part fresh breeze At day light saw a whaling Bark At 6 a m spoke her Bark Sparton of New Bedford 20 days out from home saw nothing Capt Broadnell lowered the boat and went on board At 10 a m strong breeze and rainy so ends.
