Sunday May 30th

This twenty four hours commences with strong breeze and fine rain headed to Southward At 5 p m Capt Brounell came on board Through the night wind more moderate Latter part fresh breeze saw Bark Sparten so ends.

Monday May 31st

This twenty four hours commences with strong breeze from S W and fine rain headed S S E Through the night headed S Latter part light air and calm saw blackfish lowered the boats got pore At noon cloudy and rainy no obs so ends

Lat D B 33°50 Long 41°37.

Tuesday June 1st

This twenty four hours commences with calm and light air from Southward Steers W N W At sun down short in sails luff to headed S W by W Through the night calm Latter part light air from Westward headed to the Southward so ends

Lat 33°35 Long 41°38

Wednesday June 2nd

This twenty four hours commences with light air from Westward and fine weather headed to the Southward At sun down short in sails Through the night the same At day light wind hauled S E set the sails and steered W N W saw blackfish so ends.

Lat 33°27 Long 41°45

Thursday June 3rd

This twenty four hours commences with fine breeze from S W and cloudy weather headed W N W At sun down short in sails Through the night the same Latter part strong breeze headed the same so ends.

Lat 33°30 Long 43°01 Bar 30.0

Friday June 4th

This twenty four hours commence with fresh gale from S W and passing clouds headed W N W At 2 p m gale increased double reefed the top sail and furled the fore sail At 5 p m had rain squall from Westward wore ship headed S S W Through the night headed S S E At day light wore ship headed W N W weather the same so ends.
