Saturday June 5th

This twenty four hours commences with fresh gale from S.W. and squally weather steered N. and set the fore sail At 4 p.m. steered S by E sun down huf to and furled the fore sail headed W N W Through the night the same Latter part strong breeze steered N E At 8 A.m. set the fore sail so ends

Sunday June 6th

This twenty four hours commences with strong N.W. steered E At sun down huf to headed to the Northward Through the night wind moderated Latter part light breeze set the sails and steered S E so ends.

Lat 34°28 Long 41°45

Monday June 7th

First part this twenty four hours commences with light breeze from N.W. and fair weather steered S E At 2 1/2 p.m. saw blackfish lowered the boats At 5 p.m. boats returned got none At sun down short in sails headed W Through the night wind hauled to the Northward Latter part steered S E W employed in repairing the fore sail At noon finish it and bent it on saw a whaling Bark bound to N.E so ends

This twenty four hours commences with fine breeze from East and fine weather tack ship headed N E by N employed in breaking out for provision and water At sun down short in sails Through the night fresh breeze Latter part strong breeze from E S E headed N E under of short sails so ends

Wednesday June 9th

This twenty four hours commences with strong breeze from E S E and cloudy weather steered N W by N At sun down wore ship huf to headed S and furled the fore sail Through the night the same Latter part steered W S W so ends

Lat 34°33 Long 43°07

Thursday June 10th

This twenty four hours commences with strong breeze from E S E and passing clouds steered N W by N spoke Sch Cohonet from Fairhaven 40 days out from home clean Through the night headed to the N E At 5 A.m. wore ship headed to the Southward and set the fore sail and set the job so ends
