This twenty four hours commences with fresh breeze from ESE and cloudy weather headed to the Westward spoke Sch Cohannet Capt went on board at 5 p m he returned sun down furled the fore sail wore ship headed NE Through the night the same At day light fine breeze wore ship headed to the Southward and set the sails so ends

Lat 34°26 Long 43°00

Saturday June 12th

This twenty four hours commences with fine breeze from Eastward and fair weather headed to the Southward At 3 p m back ship headed NE by N At sun down short in sails Through the night the same At day light set the sails At 9 A m wore ship headed S so ends

Lat 35°01 Long 42°24

Sunday June 13th

This day commences with fine breeze from ESE and fair weather headed S At 2 p m spoke Bark Sparton Capt Ship sun down short in sails Through the night the same Latter part set the sails so ends saw Sparton and Cohannet to the Westward

This twenty four hours commences with fine breeze from ESE and fine weather headed NE by E At sun down wore ship headed S and short in sails Through the night the same At day light set all the sails so ends.
