Thursday June 17th

This twenty four hours commences with light breeze from ESE and fine weather tack ship headed NE by E sun down tack ship headed S At midnight wind hauled to the Southward tack ship headed E by N Latter part light air and calm headed NE by N so ends

Friday June 18th

This twenty four hours commences with light air from ESE and calm headed NE At sun down short in sails Through the night the same At day light set the sails headed NE by E Employed in ship duty so ends

Lat 34°18 Long 42°10

Saturday June 19th

This twenty four hours commences with light air from Eastward and calm headed NE At sun down short in sails tack ship headed SE by E Through the night the same At day light set the sails had fine breeze headed SE by E hands employed in ship duty so ends

Lat 33°50 Long 41°27

Sunday June 20th

This twenty four hours commences with fine breeze from Eastward and good weather headed SE by E At sun down furlled the gallant sail Muddle and Latter part the same so ends

Lat 32°50 Long 40°20

Monday June 21st

This twenty four hours commences with fine breeze from ENE and fair weather tack ship headed N by E under of all sails Muddle and Latter part light breeze saw several vessels so ends

Lat 34°32 Long 40°45

Tuesday June 22nd

This twenty four hours commences with light breeze from ENE and calm headed N by E At 2 1/2 p m tack ship headed SE by E spoke merchant vessel No from New York Muddle and Latter part headed SE Employed in ship duty so ends
