Tuesday June 29th

This twenty four hours commences with strong breeze from W S W and squally weather under of sheet sails hup to headed. At sun down furled the fore sail Through the night light winds and rainy Latter part fresh breeze and passing clouds headed to the Northward so ends.

Wednesday June 30th

This twenty four hours commences with fine breeze from S W headed to N W under of all sails At 3 p m tack ship headed to the Southward Employed in boiling the Blackfish blubber At 4 p m finish boiling sun down short in sails Middle part light winds and calm Latter part light air set the sails so ends

Thursday July 1st

This day commences with light air from N W and calm weather At 2 p m had fine breeze headed W by S sun down short in sails Middle part the same Latter part fresh breeze and squally set the sails headed W N W so ends

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Friday July 2nd

This twenty four hours commences with fine breeze from N N E and passing clouds headed N W under of all sails At sun down furled the gallant sail and gaff topsail Middle and Latter part light air and calm and rain squalls so ends no obs.

Saturday July 3rd

This twenty four hours commences with light air from N E and rain squalls At 4 p m light breeze headed N by E At sun down short in sails Through the night and Latter part fine breeze from E headed N N E under of all sails so ends.

Lat 36°02 Long 40°07

Sunday July 4th

This twenty four hours commences with fine breeze from Eastward and fair weather headed N N E killed a pig hands employed in ship duty At 7 p m tack ship headed S W and short in sails through the night the same Latter part set the sails headed the same so ends
