

Remarks on board of Brig

Monday July 5th

This twenty four hours commences with fine breeze from Southward and good weather headed S W At 3 p m wind hauled headed W S W sun down short in sails Through the night light winds and calm Latter part moderate set the sails Employed in breaking out for water so ends

Lat 35°50 Long 42°10

Tuesday July 6th

This twenty four hours commences with light air from Eastward and calm weather headed to the Southward sun down short in sails Middle and Latter part the same so ends pick up a barrel 1/4 full of black vernish.

Lat 35°41 Long 42°16

Wednesday July 7th

This twenty four hours commences with calm and light air from N E At 3:40 p m saw a Sperm whale lowered the boats W Boat darted At whale but did not get fast At 10 p m boats returned Through the night steered W N W Latter part steered N N W at 9 a m led to by the wind headed to the Eastward so ends

Thursday July 8th

This twenty four hours commences with light breeze from S E and fine weather headed to the Eastward At sun down back ship headed S S W and short in sails At 1 p m wore ship headed E N E Latter part breeze the same At 9 A m wore ship headed to the Southward saw several sails bound to the Northward so ends under of all sails.

Lat 35°47 Long 42°27

Friday July 9th

This twenty four hours commences with fine breeze from S E and good weather headed to the Southward At sun down short in sails Through the night the same At day light wore ship and set the sails headed to the northward Employed in black vernishing the anchors and iron works saw several sails so ends.

Lat 35°31 Long 42°34

Saturday July 10th

This day commences with light breeze from Eastward and fine weather headed S S E Employed in cleaning the windlers and black vernish it At sun down short in sails Through the night the same At day light wore ship and set the sails with light breeze headed N N E At 8 A m spoke an English Bark (Martha) of Shoreham Employed in ship duty so ends with moderate weather
