Sunday July 11th

This twenty four hours commences with light breeze from Eastward headed to N E At sun down short in sails At 1 A. m. wind hauled to the Southward headed E by S At day light set the sails had light breezes and calm saw Bark Martha to the Northward so ends

Lat 35° 40 Long 41° 57

Monday July 12th

This twenty four hours commences with light air from S E and calm headed to the Eastward At 4 p. m. calm short in sails Through the night the same latter part fine breeze from S set all the sails headed E S E hands employed in middle stitching the fly jib, pick up a barrel of kerosene so ends.

Lat 35° 48 Long 41° 10

Tuesday July 13th

First part this twenty four hours commences with fine breeze from S and fine weather headed E S E hands employed in middle stitching the middle stay sail At sun down short in sails Through the night the same At day light set the sails and steered E S E so ends

Wednesday July 14th

This twenty four hours commences with fine breeze from S S W and good weather steered E S E under of all sails saw two sails to the Eastward sun down short in sails Through the night the same latter part set the sails At 8 1/2 A. m. back ship headed N W by W saw 4 sails so ends

Thursday July 15th

This twenty four hours commences with fine breeze from S W and good weather steered N W by W At 4 p. m. hif to headed to W N W At sun down short in sails Through the night the same latter part wore ship and set the sails headed E S E saw 4 sails so ends.

Lat 35° 55 Long 39° 48

Friday July 16th

First part this twenty four hours fine breeze from Southward headed E S E under of all sails At 5 1/2 p. m. spoke Bark C W Morgan 3 months out 20 barrels sun down short in sails Through the night light breeze and calm latter part the same set the sails so ends
