

Remarks on board of Brig

Friday July 23rd

This twenty four hours commences with fine breeze from WNW and fair weather headed to SW At sun down short in sails Through the night the same Latter part light breeze from NW set the sails headed WSW so ends.

Lat 34° 05' Long 37° 02'

Saturday July 24th

This twenty four hours commences with light breeze from NW and calm headed WSW At 5 p m took down the main top mast to repair it found rotten place in it At sun down short in sails Through the night the same Latter part set the sails Employed in Making a gallant mast and splice it in top mast so ends

Lat 33° 27' Long 37° 03'

Sunday July 25th

This twenty four hours commences with light breeze from NW and calm headed WSW At 2 p m finish repairing the mast and sent it up set up the rigging At sun down short in sails Through the night the same Latter part fine breeze from Westward set the sails back ship headed NW by N so ends

Lat 33° 13' Long 37° 18'

Monday July 26th

First part this twenty four hours fine breeze from Westward and cloudy weather headed to NW At 2 p m pick up a barrel of kerosine At sun down furled the light sails Through the night squally short in sails Latter part strong breeze and squalls set the jib and took reef out of top sail and single reef the main sail so ends.

Lat 33° 39' Long 37° 50'

Tuesday July 27th

This twenty four hours commences with strong breeze from W and squally weather headed NWN At sun down short in sails Middle and Latter part strong breeze and squally headed NW by N Employed in breaking out for provision so ends.

Lat 34° 29' Long 38° 35'

Wednesday July 28th

This twenty four hours commences with fresh gale from Westward and cloudy weather headed NW by N under of short sails Through the night the same At day light wind more moderate set the sails Had few rain squalls so ends.
