Thursday July 29th

This twenty four hours commences with fine breeze from Westward and fair weather headed N N W At 4 p m saw black fish lowered the boats At 5 boats returned got none wore ship headed S W saw a sail to the Westward At midnight wore ship headed N W Latter part light breeze set all the sails At 10 A m pick up a hard pine plank Employed in split it for fire wood so ends

Friday July 30th

This twenty four hours commences with light breeze from W S W and fair weather headed N W by N At sun down short in sails Through the night headed N W Latter part fine weather under of all sails headed W N W hands employed in ship duty saw blackfish so ends

Lat 35°16 Long 39°40

Saturday July 31st

This twenty four hours commences with light breeze from S W and good weather headed W N W At 5 p m wind shifted headed S by W headed W S W At sun down short in sails Middle and Latter part light breezes still cruising Employed in setting up the guys and stays saw one sail so ends

Sunday August 1st

This twenty four hours commences with light breeze from W by N and good weather headed S W At sun down short in sails Through the night the same Latter part set the sails still cruising so ends

Lat 35°24 Long 40°14

Monday August 2nd

This twenty four hours commences with fine breeze from Westward and fair weather still cruising At 4 p m spoke Bark Sparter and Bark Pioneer they saw nothing At sun down short in sails Through the night the same At day light set the sails and steered N E so ends

Lat 35°38 Long 40°04

Tuesday August 3rd

This twenty four hours commences with fine breeze and good weather still cruising At 3 p m spoke ship Emma C Jones of New Bedford 2 months out clear At sun down short in sails Through the night the same Latter part set the sails steered S S E At 9 A m huf to headed S W so ends
