

Remarks on board of Brig

Wednesday August 4th

This twenty four hours commences with fresh breeze from N^W still cruising spoke Bark Catalpa of New Bedford 3 months out 100 bbls and spoke Bark John Dawson At 5 p m strong breeze and squally furled the light sails At 6 p m reefed the top sail and furled the fore sail Through the night fresh gale from N^E and cloudy weather headed to N^NW Latter part more moderate set the fore sail saw one sail so ends.

Lat 35°42 Long 41°20

Thursday Aug 5th

This twenty four hours commences with strong breeze from N^E and cloudy weather steered W S W At two p m took reef out of top sail At sun down huf to and short in sails Middle and Latter part strong breeze At 5 A m set the fore sail and top sail steered S S W hands employed in ship duty so ends

Lat 34°58 Long 42°35

Friday Aug 6th

This day commences with strong breeze from N^E and cloudy weather steered S S W by S At sun down short in sails and headed to the Northward Through the night the same Latter part fine breeze set the sails and steered W S W so ends

Saturday Aug 7th

This twenty four hours commences with fine breeze from N^E and good weather steered N^W by W At sun down short in sails huf to headed N^E by N At 1 P m wore ship headed to the Southward Latter part light breeze and calm saw Black-fish lowered the boats got none so ends

Lat 34°52 Long 44°02

Sunday Aug 8th

This twenty four hours commences with light air from Northward and calm steered S At sun down huf to headed to the Eastward short in sails Through the night the same Latter part wind W S W set the sails At 5 1/2 A m saw a whale to the windward of the vessel and saw Bark Ohio she had boats down after whales At 7 1/2 A m lowered the two larboard boats At 10 A m boats came on board whales went quick to the windward had fresh breeze and squally so ends

Lat 35°05 Long 44°10

Monday Aug 9th

Commences with fresh breeze from W N W At 2 1/2 p m saw a whale to the windward Ohio had 3 boats down we lowered the two larboard boats down At 4 p m boats returned got nothing Through the night fresh breeze Latter part saw whales lowered the boats W Boat got fast the other boats went after the school but got nothing so ends
