

Remarks on board of Brig

Saturday Aug 28th

This twenty four hours commences with calm weather At 4 p m lowered down the sails rose new top sail braces and took the old braces for main. boat halliard Through the night the same At 4 a m had light breeze from Southward shored N E by E picked up a spar for fire wood so ends with fine breeze

Lat 34°50 Long 40°13

Sunday Aug 29th

This twenty four hours commences with fine breeze from Southward and good weather Steered N E by E employed in catching fish and clean it At midnight we hauled the head yard back At day light kept her off and steered E sailed down five barrels of fish so ends with fresh breeze

Lat 35°46 Long 39°05

Monday Aug 30th

This day commences with fresh breeze from S W and squally weather steered E N E At sun down luf to headed S and short in sails Through the night the same At 8 1/2 a m steered E by S so ends with squally weather

Lat 35°14 Long 37°20

Tuesday Aug 31st

This twenty four hours commences with strong breeze from S W and squally weather steered E by S At 6 p m luf to headed S by E 1/2 E Through the night the same Latter part steered N N E At 10 1/2 a m saw a sail bears E S E hauled up for her so ends

Lat 36°23 Long 35°40

Wednesday Sept 1st

This twenty four hours commences with fresh breeze from S W and cloudy weather steered E S E At 3 p m spoke Bark Havn Capt Briggs 15 months out 390 bars At sun down short in sails wore ship headed W N W Through the night the same Latter part took reef out of the top sail and set the jib saw 4 sails so ends

Lat 35°13 Long 35°30

Thursday Sept 2nd

This twenty four hours commences with fresh breeze from W S W and cloudy weather still cruising At 2 p m spoke Bark Catalpa 170 barrels At sun down short in sails Through the night squally Latter part the same so ends
